**TIS EXCELLENCY** the Governor directs the publication for general information, of the following extract from the New Zealand "Customs Regulation Act, 1858," and that it be notified at the same time that all the Ports of New Zealand will be approved by His Excellency the Governor of that Province for the importation of Tobacco.

#### EXTRACT

From 21st and 22nd Vict. No. 40. New Zealand, Sec. 32. "If any goods enu-"merated or described in the following "Table of Prohibitions shall be imported "or brought into New Zealand, then and "in every such case such goods shall be "forfeited, and shall be destroyed or other-"wise disposed of, as the Commissioner "may direct."

#### "GOODS ABSOLUTELY PROHIBITED TO BE IMPORTED."

"Books, wherein the copyright shall be "first subsisting, first composed or written "or printed in the United Kingdom, or in "New Zealand, and printed or re-printed "in any other part of the World, as to "which the proprietor of such copyright "or his agent shall have given to the "Commissioner a notice in writing that "such copyright subsists, such notice also "stating when such copyright will expire."

# Coin, viz :-- " False money or counterfeit sterling."

"Coin, of the Realm, or of any British "Possession, or any money, purporting to "be such, not being of the established "standard in weight or fineness."

"Indecent or obscene Prints, Paintings, "Books, Cards, Lithographic or other "Engravings, or other indecent or obscene "articles."

"All such infected cattle, sheep or other "animals and hides, skins, horses hoofs, "or any other part of cattle or other ani-"mals, as the Governor in Council shall "at any time prohibit in order to prevent "any infectious or contagious distemper or "disease."

"Spirits, (not being perfumed or medi-"cinal spirits,) unless in ships of forty "tons burden at least, and in casks or "other vessels capable of containing liquids, "each of such casks or other vessels being "of the size or content of fourteen gallons "at the least, and duly reported, or in "glass bottles or stone bottles, not ex-"ceeding the size of three pint bottles, "and being really part of the cargo of the "importing ship, and duly reported."

"Snuff or Tobacco, unless in ships of "forty tons burden at least, and in whole "and complete packages, each containing "not less than sixty pounds nett weight, "and not containing any other goods, and "unless into such Ports as are or may be "approved by the Governor for the impor-"tation of Tobacco."

"Cigars, unless in ships of forty tons "burden at least, and in packages con-"taining not less than sixty pounds nett "weight or not less than ten thousand in "number each, and not containing any "other goods, and unless into such Ports "as are or may be approved, as last afore-"said."

"Opium, unless in ships of forty tons "burden at least, and in whole and com-"plete packages, each containing not less "than forty-five pounds nett weight; and "not containing any other goods, and "unless into such Ports as are or may be "approved by the Governor for the impor-"tation and warehousing of Opium."

## Pastoral and Tillage Lands. Colonial Secretary's Office, Perth,

October 22nd, 1858.

THE following Regulations, applicable to Pastoral and Tillage Lands are re-published for general information :---

All rents and fees chargeable on 8 years leases after the first year, will be due on the 1st of January in each year and must be paid yearly in advance on or before the 15th of that Month, to the Collector of Internal Revenue or to any Sub-Collector nearest to the district in which the land may be situated.

If such rents and charges be not paid as herein required, the lease will be absolutely and indefcasibly forfeited, unless within 60 days after the first of January the Lessee shall duly pay the full amount of the annual rent, together with an additional sum equal to one fourth part of the same.

The legal occupants of lands in fee simple will be entitled to a preference in obtaining annual licenses of the vacant lands in Class A, adjoining to, and within one mile of their respective grants, and in proportion to the size of each of such grants, should there be more than one claimant for the same land.

All vacant land in Class A, beyond one mile from land in fee simple, will be open at all times to general application for annual license, as well as all vacant land in Class A not claimed under the preceeding regulation on or before the 1st day of December in each year.

No renewal of an annual license in Class A can be *claimed*, but licenses for the succeeding year will be granted preferably to existing Lessees, with or without amended boundaries, in the absence of any stronger recognised claim.

Applications for renewals from 1st January next, or for new leases under the Regulations of 24th July 1857, must be sent in to the Surveyor General in the established printed form by the 1st of December next, on which date they will be taken into consideration.

Should a modification of boundaries to any such run be desired previous to renewal, application for the same must be made to the Surveyor General not later in each year than the end of November.

Pending the decision of Her Majesty's Government on the proposed new Land Regulations, no Tillage leases, or Pastoral leases of land in Class B, will be granted for a longer period than the current year.

Such yearly leases will be granted without any abatement for unavailable land, and without any right of renewal, but His Excellency the Governor will be prepared on application to grant to existing Lessees fresh leases for another year of the same lands, and on the same terms and conditions, until New Regulations may be promulgated in the Colony.

Lessees under the conditions last mentioned will be entitled to claim an exchange of their Leases for others, under such New Regulations as may be approved by Her Majesty's Government.

The full amount of Rent chargeable for an Annual Lease or License, must be paid to the Revenue Department before such Lease or License can be prepared for the Governor's signature.

No Class A licenses will be issued either for the whole, or any portion of the year for a less sum than  $\pounds 1$ .

Parties claiming Class A licenses in right of being the Occupants or Owners of adjoining fee simple lands must, in their applications refer distinctly to the lands in right of which they found their claims.

Printed Forms of application are procurable at the Survey Office, or from any Resident Magistrate, without charge.
