#### PROCLAMATION.

BY HIS EXCELLENCY Arthur Edward Kennedy, Esquire, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same.

HEREAS the undermentioned Ordinance was passed by His Excellency, Arthur Edward Kennedy, Esquire, Governor of the said Coleny, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, in the 21st year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria and intituled: No. 12, "An Ordinance to extend and "enlarge the provisions of an Ordinance "passed in the twelfth year of the reign of "Her present Majesty, intituled 'An Or-"dinance for the Regulation of Gaols, "Prisons, and Houses of Correction in the "Colony of Western Australia,' and for "other purposes relating thereto."

NOW, therefore, I, the said Arthur Edward Kennedy, do hereby proclaim and make known unto all whom it may concern, that Her Majesty has been graciously pleased to confirm and allow the before mentioned Ordinance.
