**Public Roads between Fremantle
and the Canning and Perth.**

*Colonial Secretary's Office, Perth,
January 25th, 1859.*

The following descriptions are published
for general information, of certain
lines of Road it is intended to open and
adopt in vicinity of the River Canning, and
thence to Perth and Fremantle.

1st. Between the lower Canning Bridge
near Middleton's and the upper Canning
Bridge on location 14,—the same to be
extended Easterly from the Bridge first
mentioned to the North corner of location
20a on the Cannings' right bank, passing
through locations 37, 1, 2, and 41, then
Southeasterly through locations 5, 6, and
7, to the public crossing place over Yule's
Brook in location 8,—thence to and across
the River Canning from location 8 to No.
19, and upwards through locations 19, 18,
and 17, to the Bridge over Woongan
Brook, and finally from said Bridge to that
over the Canning at location 14; the tracks
at present in use along the lines herein de-
scribed being reserved for public use until
the permanent Roads can be laid out and
finally adopted.

2nd. Between the above crossing over
the Canning River and the Fremantle Road
hereinafter described as No. 3,—the same
to extend in a Southwesterly direction
about $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles from said crossing through
location 19, then Westerly about 3 miles
and Southerly about 1 mile to the Road
No. 3.

3rd. Between Woongan Bridge and
Fremantle, to extend Westerly as laid out
and cleared under direction of Mr. R.
Austin in 1853, passing through locations
17, 18, 19, 21, 26, 27, 28, and 73, to the
East boundary of Fremantle Townsite, and
thence to the located portion of the same
along the track at present in use, until
permanent lines may be laid out and
adopted.

4th. Between the lower Canning Bridge
near Middleton's and the Mill at Point
Belches, following the Road from the for-
mer towards Perth Causeway for about $\frac{3}{4}$
of a mile, and then diverging Northerly
through locations 41 and 40 to South Perth
and the Mill aforesaid.

5th. Between the Mill at Point Belches
and the Perth Causeway, following the
Road No. 4, then passing Eastward from
it along the back of the Suburban Lots on
South Shore of Perth Water, and through
locations 39, 38a, 38, and 37, to the Public
Road below the lower Canning Bridge and
Perth Causeway.
