## PROCLAMATION.

BY HIS EXCELLENCY Arthur Edward Kennedy, Esquire, Governor, and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same.

HEREAS the undermentioned Ordinances were passed by His Excellency, Arthur Edward Kennedy, Esquire, Governor of the said Colony, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, in the 22nd year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria and intituled :

No. 1. "An Ordinance to naturalize Joannes Antonius Baesjou."

8th September, 1858.

No. 3. "An Ordinance for vesting Church of England Lands in Western Australia in the Lord Bishop of Perth and his successors."

17th September 1858.

No. 4. "An Ordinance for vesting Roman Catholic Church Lands in Western Australia in the Roman Catholic Bishop Administrator and his successors."

17th September, 1858.

No. 6. "An Ordinance for the Incorporation and Regulation of Joint Stock Companies and other Associations, and for Limiting the Liabilities of certain of the same."

24th September, 1858.

5. 7. "An Ordinance to alter and amend the Law for regulating the Constitution of Juries and for the Trial of Issues in certain cases in the Criminal and Civil Courts of Western Australia."

4th October, 1858.

No. 8. "An Ordinance to vest in Her Majesty a certain piece of ground forming a portion of a Public thoroughfare known by the name of Pier Street in the City of Perth."

14th October, 1858.

No. 9. " An Ordinance to naturalize Sanford Duryea."

15th October, 1858.

No. 10. An Ordinance to alter the existing Law providing for the improvement of the City of Perth, and to make other regulations instead thereof."

22nd October, 1858.

NOW, therefore, I, the said Arthur Edward Kennedy, do hereby proclaim and make known unto all whom it may concern, that Her Majesty has been graciously pleased to confirm and allow the before mentioned Ordinances.
