PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Arthur Edward Kennedy, Esquire, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies and Vice-Admiral of

Local Legislature passed in the seventeenth year of the Reign of Her Most Gracious Majesty Queen Victoria, entituled "An Ordinance for further regulating the Storage of Gunpowder," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor of Western Australia with the advice of the Executive Council thereof to appoint and fix and from time to time to vary the rate of Storage Rent to be paid for any Gunpowder deposited in any Government Magazine, Now, I. the said Governor, with the advice of the said Executive Council and by virtue of the power conferred by the said Ordinance, do hereby proclaim that from and after the date of this my Proclamation, the rate of Storage Rent to be paid by the Importers or Proprietors of all Gunpowder deposited in any Government Magazine appointed by Law shall be the following:—

BY HIS EXCELLENCY Arthur Edward Kennedy, Esquire, Governor, and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same.

HEREAS the undermentioned Ordinary nances were passed by His Excellency Arthur Edward Kennedy, Esquire, Governor of the said Colony, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, in the 22nd year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria and intituled:

No. 2. "An Ordinance for the further appropriation of the Revenue for the year 1857, and for the general appropriation of the Revenue for the year 1859.

" An Ordinance to enable the Governor to borrow £7.000 and to apply the same towards the erection of a new Government House.'

NOW. therefore, I, the said Arthur Edward Kennedy, do hereby proclaim and make known unto all whom it may concern, that Her Majesty has been graciously pleased to confirm and allow the before mentioned Ordinances.
