PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Arthur Edward Kennedy, Esquire, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies and Vice-Admiral of the same.

WHEREAS by an Ordinance of the Local Legislature passed in the seventeenth year of the Reign of Her Most Gracious Majesty Queen Victoria, entitled "An Ordinance for further regulating the Storage of Gunpowder," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor of Western Australia with the advice of the Executive Council thereof to appoint and fix and from time to time to vary the rate of Storage Rent to be paid for any Gunpowder deposited in any Government Magazine, Now, I the said Governor, with the advice of the said Executive Council and by virtue of the power conferred by the said Ordinance, do hereby proclaim that from and after the date of this my Proclamation, the rate of Storage Rent to be paid by the Importers or Proprietors of all Gunpowder deposited in any Government Magazine appointed by Law shall be the following:—

Governor to borrow £7,000 and to apply
the same towards the erection of a new
Government House."

that Her Majesty has been graciously
pleased to confirm and allow the before
mentioned Ordinances.
