PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Arthur Edward Kennedy, Esquire, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies and Vice-Admeral of the same.

Local Legislature passed in the seventeenth year of the Reign of Her Most Gracious Majesty Queen Victoria, entituled "An Ordinance for further regulating the Storage of Gunpowder," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor of Western Australia with the advice of the Executive Council thereof to appoint and fix and from time to time to vary the rate of Storage Rent to be paid for any Gunpowder deposited in any Government Magazine, Now, I, the said Governor, with the advice of the said Executive Council and by virtue of the power conferred by the said Ordinance, do hereby proclaim that from and after the date of this my Proclamation, the rate of Storage Rent to be paid by the Importers or Proprietors of all Gunpowder deposited in any Government Magazine appointed by Law shall be the following:—

RATES OF STORAGE.
For Gunpowder used for Sporting purposes.

For each and every barrel or package containing 50 lbs. and not

exceeding 100 lbs. per week.... 0 2
For each and every barrel or package containing less than 50 lbs. per week...... 0 1
For Gunpowder used for Blasting purposes.
For each and every barrel or package containing 50 lbs. and not exceeding 100 lbs. per week... 0 1
For each and every barrel or package containing less than 50 lbs. per week... 0 1

TTH reference to the following notice published in the New Zealand Gazette, of the 18th November, 1858, p. 156,—

"NOTICE TO MARINERS.

PENCARROW LIGHTHOUSE.

"TOTICE is hereby given that on "and after the 1st day of "January next a new Light will be exhibited on Pencarrow Head at the entrance of Port Nicholson, (Wellington), "Cook's Strait, New Zealand."

"The New Light will be of the second order (Catadioptric system) with eclipses at intervals of two minutes; it will be 420 feet above high water mark, and visible in ordinary weather at a distance of thirty English miles.

"The following are the magnetic bear"ings and distances of the site of the new
"Lighthouse:—

"From Baring Head, N. W. by N.,

" $3\frac{1}{4}$ miles. "From Sinclair Head, E. by N. $\frac{1}{2}$ N. $6\frac{1}{2}$ " miles

" 33 miles." The Lighthouse is in Latitude 410

" 22' 0" S.

" Longitude 174° 51' 15" E." it is hereby notified that the Government have received information that on and after the 1st day of September next the Light exhibited since the 1st day of January last, on Pencarrow Head, at the entrance of Port Nicholson (Wellington) Cook's Strait, New Zealand, will be a fixed Light and not subject to eclipses at intervals of two minutes, as described in the above notice.
