HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR directs it to be notified for general information that the following alterations have been made in the law:—

23rd Vict. No. IV. A penalty of not less than one pound nor more than five pounds has been created by this Ordinance for enclosing letters or any writing, printing, and engraving in public newspapers, books or pamphlets sent through the Post Office.

23rd Vict. No. V. The "Ordinance for regulating the Police in Western Australia," is made by this Ordinance to apply throughout the Colony. And a penalty of any sum not exceeding five pounds has been created for any person using to another, or in the hearing of another, any abusive, profane, obscene, or indecent language, whether calculated to lead to a breach of the peace or not, and in any place whatsoever.

And from and after the first of January next, the owner or proprietor of every

cart, dray, or waggon whatsoever, not being a spring cart, dray or waggon shall legibly paint or cause to be painted in letters of not less than one inch in length on the front rail or near side of such cart, dray or waggon, his name, and place of abode, under a penalty of not exceeding twenty shillings.

23rd Vict. No. IX. Every person not holding a public license who shall sell any Colonial Wine the produce of land in the said Colony in a less quantity than Five Gallons without a license under the Ordinance 20th Vict. No. 2, of 1856, will incur a penalty of Twenty pounds.
