**C**EYLON. THE COLOMBO LIGHT will be under repairs from the 1st of February to the 1st of April, 1860, during which time there will be a temporary Light upon the Clock Tower, upon which much dependence cannot be placed. Ships approaching Colombo by night should therefore be very cautious, and keep their Deep Sea lead going. It is worthy of remark, that if soundings off Ceylon be got between Thirty and Forty fathoms, the Ship is within Five or Six leagues of the land, and had better not near till daylight.

**H**IS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR directs it to be notified for general information that the following alterations have been made in the law :—

23rd Vict. No. IV. A penalty of not less than one pound nor more than five

pounds has been created by this Ordinance for enclosing letters or any writing, printing, and engraving in public newspapers, books or pamphlets sent through the Post Office.

23rd Vict. No. V. The "Ordinance for regulating the Police in Western Australia," is made by this Ordinance to apply throughout the Colony. And a penalty of any sum not exceeding five pounds has been created for any person using to another, or in the hearing of another, any abusive, profane, obscene, or indecent language, whether calculated to lead to a breach of the peace or not, and in any place whatsoever.

And from and after the first of January next, the owner or proprietor of every cart, dray, or waggon whatsoever, not being a spring cart, dray or waggon shall legibly paint or cause to be painted in letters of not less than one inch in length on the front rail or near side of such cart, dray or waggon, his name, and place of abode, under a penalty of not exceeding twenty shillings.

23rd Vict. No. IX. Every person not holding a public license who shall sell any Colonial Wine the produce of land in the said Colony in a less quantity than Five Gallons without a license under the Ordinance 20th Vict. No. 2, of 1856, will incur a penalty of Twenty pounds.
