PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Arthur Edward Kennedy, Esquire, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same.

N pursuance of the Authority in me vested by the 16th section of an Ordinance passed in the 19th Year of the Reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, No. 15, intituled "An Ordinance to "Consolidate and Amend the Laws re-"specting the Licensing of Boats and "Boatmen." I do hereby notify and proclaim that the Regulations hereunto hereunto annexed are and shall be the Regulations to be observed for the preservation of the Government Jetties at Fremantle, until altered or amended as occasion may require.

- Regulations for the management of the Public Jetties at Fremantle, in accordance with the Provisions of the Ordinance 19th Victoria, No. 15.
- 1. Goods may be landed at both Jetties any hour after sunrise and before sunset.
- 2. No Vessel or Cargo Boat shall be fastened to any part of the Public Jetties at Fremantle, except to such ring bolts or other fastenings as are or may be provided for the purpose and no Vessel or Cargo Boat shall lie alongside of such Jetties unless so fastened. All Vessels, Cargo Boats, or Flats so fastened shall also be anchored in such a manner as to relieve the Jetties as much as possible from the weight of such craft.
- 3. No Vessel or Cargo Boat shall be so fastened, except for the purpose of loading or unloading, nor for any longer period than shall be reasonably required for such purpose.
- 4. Passenger Boats only shall lie alongside the steps on either Jetty, and for no longer period than may be necessary to embark or disembark Passengers
- 5. No Vessel, Cargo Boat, or Flat shall make fast or lie alongside the Fremantle Jetties, for the purpose of discharging or taking in cargo, after sunset or before sunrise.
- 6. All Vessels or Boats lying at the North end of the River Jetty at Fremantle shall on the approach of a Passsenger Steamer, haul off to a sufficient distance to enable her to disembark or embark passengers.

- No fishing whatever allowed off the 7. Jetties.
- No stone, bricks, clay, sand, lime, coals, coke, or other fuel, or timber in 8. logs are to be loaded or unloaded on the Jetties, except imported bricks and paving stones, which must be removed immediately. Firewood may be carted on the Jetties for the use of passenger steamers, but taken direct from the cart to the vessel.
- All goods to be removed from the 9. Jetties before sunset.
- 10. No Bullock Teams shall be driven on the Jetties.
- 11. No Gunpowder shall be landed or left on the Jetties without a Keeper, nor without being well covered with a Tarpaulin.
- 12. All Goods landed at Fremantle from the Sea, to be landed at the South Jetty, and Boatmen are to expose to view the marks and numbers of all packages so landed, and no goods should be landed at any other place without first obtaining the permission of the Collector of Customs.
- 13. No Goods shall be landed on the Jettics on Sunday, except in cases of extreme emergency, the permission of the Resident Magistrate of Fremantle being first obtained.
- 14. All Goods carted on the Jetties must be carefully removed from the carts, and not shot out of them. Horses in carts, only to go at a foot pace, no trotting or cantering allowed.
- 15. No stones or other kind of substance whatever shall be thrown into the water from the Jetties or from Boats lying alongside of them.
- 16. No Fire shall be made on or near any Jetty.

NO FICE.

Any Person or Persons violating these Regulations, will be prosecuted according to the Act 19th Victoria, No. 15.
