regulating the sale of Waste Lands belonging to the Crown in the Australian Colonies," I do hereby notify and proclaim that the following portion of Land will be offered for Sale by Public Auction by the Collector of Revenue at Perth on the 6th day of June, 1860, at one o'clock, at the upset price affixed thereto, on the terms and conditions set forth in certain Land Regulations dated 14th June, 1843.

Victoria location No. 358, comprising 50 acres more or less, known to contain minerals.
