PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Arthur Edward Kennedy, Esquire Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same.

Ordinances were passed by His Excellency Arthur Edward Kennedy, Esqr., Governor of the said Colony, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof in the 23rd year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria and intituled,

No. 1. An Ordinance for more effectually preventing Embezzlements by persons employed in the public service

of Her Majesty in Western Australia.

No. 2. An Ordinance to provide for the summary discharge in certain cases of persons under Committal for Felony and Misdemeanor.

No. 3. An Ordinance to improve the administration of the law so far as respects summary proceedings before Justices of the Peace.

No. 4. An Ordinance to extend the laws relating to the Post Office-

No. 5. An Ordinance to extend and amend "An Ordinance for regulating the Police in Western Australia"

No. 6. An Ordinance to Naturalize "Hyman Lipschitz."

No. 7 An Ordinance to Naturalize "The Revd. Adolphe Joseph Lecaille."

No. 8. An Ordinance to amend "An Ordinance for the better prevention of Offences."

No. 9. An Ordinance to amend and explain the law relating to the Sale of Colonial Wine.

No. 10. An Ordinance to amend "An Ordinance to provide for the summary trial and punishment of Aboriginal Native Offenders in certain cases."

No. 11. An Ordinance to consolidate and amend the laws prohibiting the distillation of Ardent Spirits in Western Australia, and for repealing a certain Ordinance relating thereto.
