PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Arthur Edward Kennedy, Esquire, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Western Australia and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS, certain Aboriginal Natives of the Colony of New Zealand are in arms against the Queen's Sovereign Authority, and it is therefore expedient that the exportation of warlike stores to that Colony be prohibited, Now THEREFORE, I the said Governor, by and with the Advice of the Executive Council, do hereby prohibit the exportation from any port or place, in the Colony of Western Australia, of Arms, Ammunition, Gunpowder, and Naval Stores, or any articles which may be converted to a Military or Naval purpose, except in manner, and subject to the conditions hereafter mentioned or referred to, that is to say, from and after the date hereof, Arms, Ammunition, Gunpowder, or other Warlike Stores, shall, and may be exported only, under license in writing, first obtained for that purpose, under the hand of me, the said Governor, and only at the place, in the manner, and subject to the conditions, if any specified, in such license, PROVIDED that nothing in this Proclamation shall be construed to apply to the exportation of supplies for the use of Her Majesty's Land and Sea Forces.
