HE following Titles of Bills proposed to be submitted to the Legislative Council at its next Session are published for general information.

Dog Tax.

Colonial Secretary's Office, Perth. August 28th, 1860.

IS Excellency the Governor directs it to be notified for general information that from and after the 31st December, 1860, the collection of the Tax on Dogs will not be undertaken by the Police. The attention of all persons, therefore, who keep dogs is directed to the 2nd Section of the Ordinance 4th and 5th Victoria, No. 14, hereto annexed, a compliance with the provisions of which will alone prevent their incurring the penalty of from twenty shillings to five pounds, imposed on persons keeping unlicensed dogs.

SECTION REFERRED TO.

"And be it enacted that every person "desirous of obtaining a license according "to the provisions of this Act, shall "deliver a description under his hand of "the dog for which he desires to obtain "license in the form in the annexed "Schedule, with a declaration under his "hand to the truth thereof, to the Col-"lector or sub-Collector of Revenue of the "District, who shall thereupon upon pay-"ment of the regulated fee, issue to such "person a license in the form in the an-"nexed Schedule, and every such license "shall be deemed to be in force from the "date thereof until the first day of January "then next ensuing, and no longer."
