THE following Titles of Bills proposed to be submitted to the Legislative Council at its next Session are published for general information.

A BILL to impose an Export Duty on Sandal Wood.

A BILL to make better Provision for the Punishment of Frauds committed by Trustees, Bankers and other Persons entrusted with Property."

A BILL to make Provision against the Danger of Bush and other Fires.

A BILL to amend "An Ordinance to Consolidate and Amend the Laws relating to Trespasses by Live Stock, and to Promote the Construction of Fences"

A BILL to amend "An Ordinance to Consolidate and Amend the Laws respecting the Licensing of Boats and Boatmen."

A BILL for regulating the Trade or Business of Pawnbrokers in Western Australia.

A BILL to Consolidate and Amend the Laws of the Customs in Western Australia.

A BILL to explain and extend an Ordinance intituled "An Act for the quieting of Titles to Lands in this Colony, by declaring valid certain Instruments and Transactions affecting the same."

A BILL to make compulsory the Practice of Vaccination.

A BILL to amend an Ordinance intituled "An Ordinance to regulate the Temporal Affairs of Churches and Chapels of the United Church of England and Ireland in Western Australia."

A BILL to amend the Ordinance 19th Victoria, No. 8, of 1856, to Substitute in certain cases other Punishments in lieu of Transportation.

A BILL to consolidate and amend the Laws relating to the Police in Western Australia.

A BILL for the Further Appropriation of the Revenue for the Year 1859, and for the general Appropriation of the Revenue for the Year 1861.

A BILL to naturalize the Very Reverend Raphael Martelli, the Reverend Francis Salvadó, the Reverend Ildephonsus Bertran, and the Reverend Emilian Coll.

A Bill to prohibit Aliens and Foreigners taking Whales and other Fish in the Waters of Western Australia.

TENDERS (in duplicate) endorsed "Tenders for Albany Mail" will be received at this Office up to noon on Thursday, the 22nd November next, for the conveyance of a monthly mail between Perth and Albany from 1st January 1861, to the 31st December, 1863.

The contractor to convey the mails at such dates in each month as may be fixed by the Postmaster General.

He must also convey to Perth by express at any time during the Month (on being called upon to do so by the Postmaster at Albany) any English mails that may be landed by the contract packets at Albany.

Parties tendering to state the time in which they will undertake to convey the mails between Perth and Albany and *vice versa*.

The tender stipulating to convey the mails in the shortest time between the two places will have the preference.

In case the contractor should fail to

deliver the mails at either Perth or Albany within his contract time, in consequence of the overloading of the mail cart, with passengers, or luggage, &c., he will be liable to a Penalty not exceeding £20, exclusive of any sum recoverable by his bond.

In the event of the mail Packets discontinuing to touch at King George's Sound during the period of the contract, the unexpired portion of it to be cancelled.

The arrival and departure of the mail will be subject to instructions from the Postmaster General, and liable to alterations at any time during the year.

Two approved sureties will be required to join the contractor in a guarantee for the due fulfilment of the duties contracted to be performed.

No payment will be made on account of the contract until the bond shall have been signed by the contractor and his sureties, and any breach of contract in the wilful or negligent departure or delivery of the mail at the appointed days and hour will subject the contractor to the loss of a proportionate part of his monthly pay or the cancellation of his contract.

The contractor is to convey and deliver all mails which may be entrusted to him under the authority of the Postmaster General or the Postmaster at Albany, and to provide secure and water tight lockers for the mails and covering for the same. He will moreover be bound not to convey himself, or permit his servant to convey any letter or packet to the prejudice of the Post Office Revenue under a penalty of £3 for each Offence, which penalty will be deducted from his monthly pay.

The persons employed by the Contractor to convey the mail are to be subject to the approval of the Postmaster General, both as to age and character.

Further particulars may be obtained on reference to the Postmaster General at whose Office forms of Tender may be had as well as from the Resident Magistrates.

The arrival and departure of Mails will be subject to instructions from the Postmaster General, and liable to alteration at any time during the year.

Two approved sureties will be required to join the contractors in a guarantee for the due fulfilment of the duties respectively contracted to be performed.

No payment will be made on account of any mail Contract until the bond shall have been respectively signed by the contractor and his sureties, and any breach of contract in the wilful or negligent departure or delivery of the mails at the appointed days and hours will subject the contractor to the loss of a proportionate part of his monthly pay, or the cancellation of his Contract.

The Contractors are to convey and deliver all mails which may be entrusted to them under the authority of the Postmaster General or any of the Postmasters, and to provide secure and watertight lockers for mails in carts, and coverings for the bags on horseback; the contractors moreover will be bound not to convey themselves or permit their servants to convey any letter or packet to the prejudice of the Post Office Revenue, under a penalty of £3, which penalty will be deducted from their monthly pay.

The whole of the mails may be conveyed either in spring carts or on horseback at the option of the Contractor.

The persons employed by the Contractors to convey the mails are to be subject to the approval of the Postmaster General both as to age and character.

Further particulars may be obtained on reference to the Postmaster General, at whose Office forms of Tender may be had as well as from the Resident Magistrates.
