INTENDED ROAD FROM THE BRIDGE OVER THE PRESTON RIVER TO THE HEAD OF THE FERGUSON RIVER.

T is hereby notified for general information that it is the intention of the Government as soon as means may be available to lay out and declare a line of Public Road 33 feet wide from the Bridge over the Preston River to the Bridge over the Ferguson River in Wellington location 53, thence along the left bank of the said Ferguson River, through Wellington locations 10, 27 and 45, to the West end of the South boundary of Wellington location 61, thence through Wellington locations 80 and 128, along the South boundary of Wellington location 61 aforesaid, thence in an East South-East direction to the said Ferguson River, and finally up the left bank of the said River through Wellington location 170 to Wellington location 135.

Full particulars of this line will be published in a fu'ure notice, after the road shall have been laid out and surveyed, and the public are in the mean time cautioned against fencing across or otherwise obstructing the track above described.

OTICE is hereby given, that a remission of Export Duty on all Sandal Wood cut on Crown Lands, under license, prior to the 31st December, 1860, will be allowed, provided the undermentioned regulations are complied with prior to the 31st March, 1861, after which date duty will be levied on all Sandal Wood for which exemption has not been claimed.

- 1. All persons having Sandal Wood in store which has been cut prior to the end of 1860 must make a declaration before a Magistrate, as to the quantity thereof, on receipt of such declaration by The Collector of Customs, that Officer will issue a Certificate for the remission of duty on the amount named therein, provided he is satisfied the amount named in the declaration is correct; no second certificate to be granted to any person.
- 2. All persons having Sandal Wood stacked in the bush, cut under license prior to the 31st December, 1860, must satisfy the Resident Magistrate of the district in which it lies, that such is the case, and produce to The Collector of Customs a certificate from the Resident Magistrate, as to the quantity; on receipt of such certificate, remission of duty for the amount named therein will be allowed by The Collector.
- The various Resident Magistrates and The Collector of Customs are hereby directed to issue no certificates after the 31st March, 1861, from which date, duty will be levied on all Sandal Wood not covered by such certificate.
- The certificates for remission of duty issued by The Collector of Customs are to be transferable, so as not to impede the trade in the purchase or sale of Sandal  $\operatorname{Wood}$ .
