WITH reference to the notice published in the *Government Gazette* of the 23rd October, 1860, the following description of the road to be made from the Helena Bridge to the junction of the Upper Swan and York Roads, is published for general information.

THE road to be one chain wide on the South side of the following lines and boundary marks, commencing at the Helena bridge and running South-East

through Helena location 20 to a post on the South West boundary of Helena location 20a, situate 12 chains 75 links South-East from the left bank of the Helena river, thence in a straight line to a stake placed on the South-West boundary of Helena location 18, and situate 15 chains South-East from the Helena River aforesaid and thence by another straight line to a post on the South-West boundary of Helena location 17, situate 22 chains 40 links from the aforesaid Helena River, and thence through the Helena locations 17 and 8 along the public cart road in use for several years through Robins' farm known as Helena location No. 7, and thence in a straight line through Swan locations 16 and 7, to the junction of the York road with the Upper Swan road.

THE following section of "An Act to prevent the introduction into the Colony of The Cape of Good Hope of Convicted Felons and other persons sentenced to transportation for offences against the Laws" is published for general information.

THE master of any ship or vessel arriving at any port or place in this colony, from any port or place in Western Australia, shall detain every passenger on board his ship or vessel until he have obtained from the collector, or other chief officer of customs at or nearest to the port or place of arrival, in respect of each passenger respectively, a certificate that the said master has proved, to the satisfaction of the said collector or other chief officer of customs, that the passenger in respect of whom such certificate is granted is not a prisoner of the crown, or run-away convict, or any convict coming by virtue or under cover of any conditional pardon, ticket-of-leave, or indulgence of any kind, other than a free pardon or remission of his or her sentence by Her Majesty: And any master who shall permit or suffer any passenger to land, previous to obtaining such certificate, shall be liable to a penalty of twenty-five pounds for each passenger so landing: Provided, also, that it shall be lawful for the Governor, by proclamation, to extend the provisions of this section to the masters of ships and vessels arriving from any port or place mentioned in any such proclamation; and thereupon the like effects shall, in all respects, take place as if the port or place mentioned in any such proclamation had been mentioned in this section, together with the ports and places in Western Australia.
