PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Arthur Edward Kennedy, Esquire, Governor and Commander in Chief in and over the Territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies, and Vice Admiral of the same.

HEREAS the undermentioned Ordinances were passed by His Excellency Arthur Edward Kennedy, Esquire, Governor of the said Colony, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, in the 24th year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, and intituled—

No. 1. An Ordinance to amend the Ordinance 19th Victoria, No. 8 of 1856, to substitute, in certain cases, other punishment in lieu of Transportation.

No. 2. An Ordinance for the further appropriation of the Revenue for the Year 1859, and for the general appropriation of the Revenue for the Year 1861.

No. 3. An Ordinance to explain and extend an Ordinance, intituled "An Act for the Quieting of Titles to Lands in this Colony, by declaring valid certain instruments and transactions affecting the same."

No. 4. An Ordinance to amend an Ordinance, intituled "An Ordinance to Regulate the Temporal Affairs of Churches and Chapels of the United Church of England and Ireland in Western Australia." Now, therefore, I the said Arthur Edward Kennedy do hereby proclaim and make known unto all whom it may concern, that Her Majesty has been graciously pleased to confirm and allow the before mentioned Ordinances.

DESCRIPTION of the proposed line of communication laid out and marked from the Helena Bridge at Guildford along the South Bank of the Helena river to the junction of the Upper Swan and York roads in pursuance of the 10th Vict., No. 19, and 12th Vict., No. 23.

THE road to be one chain wide on the South side of the following lines and boundary marks, commencing at the Helena bridge and running South-East through Helena location 20 to a post on the South West boundary of Helena location 20a, situate 12 chains 75 links South-East from the left bank of the Helena river, thence in a straight line to a stake placed on the South-West boundary of Helena location 18, and situate 15 chains South-East from the Helena River aforesaid and thence by another straight line to a post on the South-West boundary of Helena location 17, situate 22 chains 40 links from the aforesaid Helena River, and thence through the Helena locations 17 and 8 along the public cart road in use for several years through Robins' farm known as Helena location No. 7, and thence in a straight line through Swan locations 16 and 7, to the junction of the York road with the Upper Swan road.
