A Book Packet may contain any number of separate books, almanacks, maps, or prints, and any quantity of paper, vellum or parchment, (to the exclusion of letters, whether sealed or open), and the books, maps, papers, &c., may be either printed, written, or plain, or any mixture of the three. On the cover or outside of the packet, in addition to the name and address of the person to whom the same is to be delivered, the sender thereof shall be at liberty to subscribe a statement of the contents thereof, together with his name and address. The books, &c., may be in any binding, mounting, or covering, whether such binding be loose or attached. In case of prints or maps, rollers may accompany them, and markers, whether of paper or otherwise, may be sent with books or other printed papers.


