# A PROCLAMATION.

#### VICTORIA R.

HEREAS We are happily at Peace with all Sovereigns, Powers, and States :

And whereas Hostilities have unhappily commenced between the Government of the United States of America and certain States styling themselves the Confederate States of America:

And whereas We, being at Peace with the Government of the United States, have declared Our Royal Determination to maintain a strict and impartial Neutrality in the Contest between the said contending Parties :

We therefore have thought fit, by and with the Advice of Our Privy Council, to issue this Our Royal Proclamation :

And We do hereby strictly charge and command all Our loving Subjects to observe a strict Neutrality in and during the aforesaid Hostilities, and to abstain from violating or contravening either the Laws and Statutes of the Realm in this Behalf, or the Law of Nations in relation thereto, as they will answer to the contrary at their Peril:

And whereas in and by a certain Statute made and passed in the Fifty-ninth Year of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act to prevent the Enlisting "or Engagement of His Majesty's Sub-" jects to serve in a Foreign Service, and "the fitting out or equipping, in His Ma-"jesty's Dominions, Vessels for Warlike "Purposes, without His Majesty's Li-"cence," it is amongst other things declared and enacted as follows :

"That if any natural-born Subject of His Majesty, His Heirs and Successors, without the Leave or Licence of His Majesty, His Heirs or Successors, for that Purpose first had and obtained, under the Sign Manual of His Majesty, tanied, under the Sign Manual of His Majesty, His Heirs or Successors, or signified by Order in Council, or by Proclamation of His Majesty, His Heirs or Successors, shall take or accept, or shall agree to take or accept, any Military Com-mission, or shall otherwise enter into the Milutary mission, or shall otherwise enter into the Alfitury Service as a Commissioned or Non-commissioned Officer, or shall enlist or enter himself to enlist, or shall agree to enlist or to enter himself to serve as a Soldier, or to be employed or shall serve in any Warlike or Military Operation in the Service of or for or under or in aid of any Foreign Prince, State, Potentate, Colony, 'ro-vince, or Part of any Province or People, or of any Person or Persons exercising or assuming to exercise the Powers of Government in or over any Foreign Country, Colony, Province, or Part of any Province or People, (ther as an Officer or Soldier, or in any other Military Capacity; or if any natural-born Subject of His Majesty shall, without such Leave or Licence as aforesaid, ac-cept, or agree to take or accept, any Commission, Warrant, or Appointment as an Officer, or shall enlist or enter himself, or shall agree to enlist or enter bimself, to serve as a Sailor or Marine, or to be employed, or engaged, or shall serve in and on board any Ship or Vessel of War, or in and on board any Ship or Vessel used for any Wardlike Purpose in the Service of or for or Service as a Commissioned or Non-commissioned and on board any Snip or Vessel used or little out, or equipped or intended to be used for any Warlike Purpose, in the Service of or for or under or in aid of any Foreign Power, Prince, State, Potentate, Colony, Province, or Part of any Province or People, or of any Person or Persons exercising or assuming to exercise the Powers of Government in or over any Foreign Fowers of Government in or over any knowled Country, Colony, Province, or Part et and P vince or People : or if any natural to any for of His Majesty shall, without such active and Licence as aforesaid, engage, contract, or agree to go, or shall go to any Foreign State, Country,

Colony, Province, or Part of any Province, or to any Place beyond the Seas, with an Intent or in order to enlist or enter himself to serve, or with intent to serve in any Warlike or Military Operation whatever, whether by Land or by Sea, in the Service of or for or under or in aid of any Foreign Prince, State, Potentate, Colony, Province, or Part of any Province or People, or in the Service of or for or under or in aid of any Person or Persons exercising or assuming to exercise the Powers of Government in or over any Foreign Country, Colony, Province or Part of any Province or People either as an Officer or a Soldier, or in any other Military Capacity, or as an Officer or Sailor, or Marine in any such Ship or Vessel as aforesaid, although no Enlisting Money or Pay or Reward shall have been or shall be in any or either of the Cases aforesaid actually paid to or received by him, or by any Person to or for his Use or benefit; or if any Person whatever, within the United Kingdom of Great Britam and Ireland, or in any Part of His Majesty's Dominions elsewhere, or in any Country, Colony, Settlement, Island, or Place, belonging to or subject to His Majesty, shall hire, retain, engage, or procure, or shall attempt or endeavour to hire, retain, engage. or procure any Person or Persons whatever to enlist, or to enter or or subject to Alis Majesty, shall hire, retain, engage, or procure, or shall attempt or endeavour to hire, state, Potentate, Colony, Province, or Part of any Province or People, or for or under or in aid of any Person or Persons exercising or assuming to exercise any Powers of Government as aforesaid, or to go or to agree to go, or embark from any Part of His Majesty's Dominions, for the Puppose or with Intent to be so enlisted, entered, engaged, or employed as aforesaid, whether any Ealisting Money, Pay, or Reward shall have been or shall be actually given or received, or not; in any or either of such Cases, every Person so offending shall be deemed guilty of a Misdemeanor, and upon being

And it is in and by the said Act further enacted,—

" That if any Person, within any Part of the United Kingdom, or in any Part of His Majesty's Dominions beyoud the Seas, shall, without the Leave and Licence of His Majesty for that Purpose first had and obtained as aforesaid, equip, furnish, fit out, or arm, or attempt or endeavour to equip, turnish, fit out, or arm, or procure to be equipped, furnishing, fitting out, or armed, or shall knowingly aid, assist, or be concerned in the equipping, furnishing, fitting out, or arming, of any Ship or Vessel, with Intent, or in order that such Ship or Vessel, shall be employed in the Service of any Foreign Prince, State, or Potentate, or of any Foreign Colony, Province, or Part of any Province or People, or of any Person or Persons, exercising or assuming to exercise any Powers of Government in or over any Foreign State. Colony, Province, or Part of any Province or People as a Transport or Store Ship, or with Intent to cruise or commit Hostillities against any Prince, State, or Potentate, or against the Subjects or Citizens of any Prince, State, or Potentate, or against the Persons exercising or assuming to exercise the Powers of Government in any Colony, Province, or Part of any Province or Country, or against the Inhabitants of any Foreign Colony, Province, or Part of any Province or Country, with whom His Majesty shall not then be at War; or shall, within the United Kingdom, or any of His Majesty's Dominions, or in any Settlement, Colony, Territory, Island, or Place belonging or subject to His Majesty, issue or deliver any Commission for any Ship or Vessel, to the Intent that such Ship or Vessel shall be employed as aforesaid, every such Person so offendiag shall be deemed guilty of a Misdemeanor, and shall, upon Conviction thereof upon any Information or Indictment, be punished by Fine and Imprisonment, or either of them, at the discretion of the Court in which such Offender shall be convicted; and every such Ship or Vessel, with the Tackle, Apparel, and Furniture, together with all the Materials, Arms, Ammunition, and Stores, which may belong to or be on board of any such Ship or Vessel, shallbe forfeited; and it shall be lawful for any Officer of His Majesty's Customs or Excise, or any Officer of His Majesty's Navy, who is by Law empowered to make Seizures for any Forfeiture incurred under any of the Laws of Customs or Excise, or the Laws of Trade and Navigation, to seize such Ships and Vessels aforesaid, and in such Places and in such Manner in which the Officers of His Majesty's Navy are empowered respectively to make Seizures under the Laws of Customs and Excise, or under the Laws of Trade and Navigation; and that every such Ship and Vessel, with the Tackle, Apparel, and Furniture, together with all the Materials, Arms, Ammunition, and Stores which may belong to or be on board of such Ship or Vessel, may be prosecuted and condemned in the like Manner and in such Courts as Ships or Vessels may be prosecuted and condemned for any Breach of the Laws made for the Protection of the Laws of Trade and Navigation."

And it is in and by the said Act further enacted.—

"That if any Person in any Part of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, or in any Part of His Majesty's Dominions beyond the Seas, without the Leave and Licence of His Majesty for that Purpose first had and obtained as aforesaid, shall, by adding to the number of the Guns of such Vessel, or by changing those on board for other Guns, or by the addition of any Equipment for War, increase or augment, or procure to be increased or augmented, or shall be knowingly concerned in increasing or augmenting, the Warlike Force of any Ship or Veasel of War, or Cruizer, or other armed Vessel, which at the Time of her Arrival in any Part of the United Kingdom, or any of His Majesty's Dominions was a Ship of War, Cruizer, or Armed Vessel in the Service of any Foreign Prince, State, or Potentate, or of any Person or Persons exercising, or assuming to exercise any Powers of Government in or over any Colony, Province, or Part of any Province or People belonging to the Subjects of any such Prince, State, or Potentate, or to the Inhabitants of any Colony, Province, or Part of any Province or Country under the Control of auy Person or Persons so exercising or assuming to exercise the Powers of Government, every such Person so offending shall be deemed guilty of a Misdemeanor, and shall, upon being convicted thereof upon any Information or Indictment, be punished by Fine and Imprisonment, or either of them, at the Discretion of the Court before which such Offender shall be convicted."

Now, in order that none of our Subjects may unwarily render themselves liable to the Penalties imposed by the said Statute, We do hereby strictly command, that no Person or Persons whatsoever do commit any Act, Matter, or Thing whatsoever, contrary to the Provisions of the said Statute, upon Pain of the several Penalties by the said Statute imposed, and of Our high Displeasure.

And We do hereby further warn all Our loving Subjects, and all Persons whatsoever entitled to Our Protection, that if any of them shall presume, in contempt of this Our Royal Proclamation, and of Our high Displeasure, to do any Acts in derogation of their Duty, as Subjects of a Neutral Sovereign in the said Contest, or in violation or contravention of the Law of Nations in that behalf; as for Example, and more especially, by entering into the Military Service of either of the said contending Parties as Commissioned or Non-Commissioned Officers or Soldiers; or by serving as Officers, Sailors, or Marines on board any Ship or Vessel of War or Transport of or in the Service of either of the said contending Parties; or by serving as Officers, Sailors, or Marines on board any Pri-vateer bearing Letters of Marque of or from either of the said contending Parties; or by engaging to go or going to any Place beyond the Seas with Intent to enlist or engage in any such Service, or by procuring or attempting to procure, within Her Majesty's Dominions at home or abroad, others to do so; or by fitting out, arming, or equipping any Ship or Vessel to be employed as a Ship of War or Priv-ateer or Transport by either of the said contending Parties: or by breaking or endeavouring to break any Blockade' law-fully and actually established by or on behalf of either of the said contending Parties; or by carrying Officers, Soldiers, Despatches, Arms, Military Stores, or Materials, or any Article or Articles considered and deemed to be Contraband of War, according to the Law or Modern Usage of Nations, for the Use or Service of either of the said contending Parties, all Persons so offending will incur and be liable to the several Penalties and penal Consequences by the said Statute or by the Law of Nations in that behalf imposed or denounced.

And We do hereby declare, that all Our Subjects, and Persons entitled to Our Protection, who may misconduct themselves in the Premises, will do so at their Peril and of their own wrong, and that they will in nowise obtain any Protection fromUs against any Liabilities or penal Consequences, but will, on the contrary, incur Our high Displeasure by such Misconduct.

> Given at Our Court at the White Lodge, Richmond Park, this Thirteenth Day of May, in the Year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and Sixty-one, and in the Twenty-fourth Year of Our Reign.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Arthur Edward Kennedy, Esquire, Governor and Commander-in-Chief, in and over the Territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same.

HEREAS, by certain Land Regulations set forth in Her Most Gracious Majesty the Queen's Order in Council, dated the 22nd day of March, 1850, it is declared, among other things, that nothing in that Order or in any Pas-toral Lease granted under the provisions thereof, should prevent the Governor from making Grants or Sales of any Lands com-prised in such lease for public purposes, nor from entering upon and disposing of in such other manner as for the public interests may seem best, such lands as may be required for facilitating the improvement and settlement of the Colony : And whereas I the said Governor am satisfied the progress of population requires the lands hereinafter particularized to be opened for disposal, agricultural occupation, and the improvement and settlement of the colony --- Now, therefore, I the said Governor, by virtue and in exercise of the authority in me vested, do hereby notify and proclaim unto all whom it may copcern, that I do hereby resume and reserve absolutely, and also do intend to offer for disposal, sale. and grant, in manner hereinafter provided, all that piece or parcel of land situate in the Victoria District, containing twenty thousand acres more or less, and forming the centre portion of the Pastoral Leases, Numbers 61 and 62, now in the tenure and occupation of Messrs. Hamersley and Co., which said piece or parcel of land is West line of about nine hundred chains in length, from a spot about one hundred and ten chains North East. and about three hundred chains South East from North corner of Victoria location No. 22. On the South East by a North East line of about three hundred chains from the spot above described, opposite boundaries pa-rallel and equal and all true: Provided that such resumed land will be opened for selection, sale, and tillage lease, in several portions of about five thousand acres, each of which will be notified from time to time as occasion may require, by the Government in the "Government Gazette.'
