#### PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Arthur Edward Kennedy, Esquire, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies, and Vice Admiral of the same.

HEREAS the undermentioned Ordinances were passed by His Excellency Arthur Edward Kennedy, Esquire, Governor of the said Colony with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof in the 24th year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, and intituled,

No. 7. An Ordinance for regulating the Trade or Business of Pawnbrokers in Western Australia.

No. 9. An Ordinance to amend "An "Ordinance to consolidate and "amend the Laws respecting the "Licensing of Boats and Boat-"men."

No. 10. An Ordinance to make better provision for the Punishment of frauds committed by Trustees,
Bankers and other persons entrusted with property.

No. 11. An Ordinance to make compulsory the practice of Vaccination.

No. 12, An Ordinance to prohibit Aliens and Foreigners taking Whales and other Fish in the Waters of Western Australia.

No. 13. An Ordinance to naturalize the Very Reverend Raphael Martelli, the Reverend Francis Salvadó, the Reverend Ildephonsus Bertran, and the Reverend Emilian Coll.

No. 14. An Ordinance to provide for the extension of the Boundaries of the Town of Newcastle.

Now therefore, I, the said Arthur Edward Kennedy do hereby proclaim and make known unto all whom it may concern that Her Majesty has been graciously pleased to confirm and allow the before mentioned Ordinances. Given under my hand and the Public Seal of the Colony at Perth this 23rd Day of August, 1861.
