#### NOTICE TO MARINERS.

Dangerous Rock off the mouth of the River Glenelg.

In May last, Mr. Walsh, master of the s. steamer Ruby reported that on his passage from this port to Port Macdonnel he had discovered a rock about four feet above

Notice is hereby given that the Harbor Master of Portland Bay has fixed the position of this danger by triangulation from the shore, to be in lat. 38° 6' 45" S. and long. 140° 51' E., about three in the off shore, and about twelve (12) miles to the eastward of Cape Northumberland.

Commanders of vessels and others in possession of charts of the coast between Cape Bridgewater and Cape Northumberland are recommended to mark this danger on their maps as the "Ruby" Rock.
