THE following Titles of Bills proposed to be submitted to the Legislative Council at its next Sessions are published for general information.

A Bill for altering Collie Street in the Town of Fremantle and for altering the limits of the "Fremantle Building Allotment No. 451."

A Bill for vesting the Ordnance Lands and Buildings in the Principal Secretary of State for the War Department.

A Bill to amend an Ordinance intituled "An Ordinance to regulate the keeping and carriage of Gunpowder."

A Bill to regulate the carriage of Passengers by Vessels engaged in the Coasting Trade.

A Bill to facilitate the recovery of Debts.

A Bill to amend "The Jury Ordinance, 1858."

A Bill to organize and establish a Volunteer Military Force in Western Australia

A Bill to repeal "An Ordinance for Licensing Hawkers and Pedlars," and to make other Provisions in lieu thereof.

A Bill for consolidating and amending the Laws relating to the Police in Western Australia, and for removing and preventing nuisances and obstructions therein.

A Bill for the more speedy levying of forfeited Recognizances.
