ALBANY JETTY REGULATIONS.

*Colonial Secretary's Office, Perth,
19th November, 1861.*

THE Jetty at present in use at Albany, being only adapted for the landing and embarking of passengers and light luggage, it is directed that:—

1st. No cargo boat, lighter, or other boat heavier than a whale boat, be made fast thereto; and that, only during the time necessary for embarking or landing passengers and their luggage.

2nd. No stone, bricks, clay, sand, lime, coals, coke, or other fuel, or timber in logs, or any other weighty articles, to be loaded or unloaded on the Jetty.

3rd. All goods to be removed from the Jetty before sunset.

4th. No stones or other kind of substances whatever, shall be thrown into the water from the Jetty or from boats lying alongside of it.

5th. No fire shall be made near the Jetty.

6th. No fishing whatever allowed off the Jetty.

Any person or persons violating these regulations, will be prosecuted according to the act 19th Victoria, No. 15.

Coppin's Sussex Location b.

CHAMPION BAY.—PORT REGULATIONS.

THE following Regulations are published for general information:—

1. Masters of Vessels lying in the port of Champion Bay, desiring to dispose of ballast, must do so at a spot bearing West by North from Mount Fairfax, and North by East from Point Moore.

2. Masters of vessels, requiring ballast, may take the same from any part of the beach in front of the townsite of Geraldton.

3. Coasters and cargo boats receiving ballast from ships, must discharge the same as near Point Moor Reef as their draft of water will permit, consistent with safety.

4. Any breach of the above Regulations will be punished according to law.
