Downing Street, 9th September, 1861.

Sir,—I have the honour to acquaint you that your period of service having expired, I have submitted the name of Mr. J. S. Hampton as your successor in the government of Western Australia.

I will give you the earliest intimation of the period at which Mr. Hampton may propose to leave England to assume his duties, in order that you may make your arrangements for leaving the Colony.

It is satisfactory to me in making this communication to you, to be able to convey to you the thanks of Her Majesty's Government for the services which you have rendered to the Colony during the time you have held the Government. Your conduct of affairs has met with their entire approval.

Court House, Fremantle, 2nd December, 1861.

THE Board appointed by His Excellency the Governor for the purpose of Licensing Boats and Boatmen for the year 1862, will assemble at the Court House, Fremantle, on Tuesday, the 31st December instant, at ten o'clock in the forenoon; also on Monday, 6th January, 1862, at the same hour.

Owners of boats and flats in Perth and Fremantle, will have their boats ready for inspection at the North or South Jetties, betwixt the hours of ten and twelve on the respective licensing days.

Names and numbers to be painted on boats before submitted to the inspection of the Board.

Boatmen applying for Licenses under the Act, will come prepared with such certificates of character and competency as they may be able to obtain. All parties found working Boats without a license after the above mentioned licensing days, will be fined according to act of Council.

Cart licenses will also be granted on the same days.
