GREETING.

Unow Xe, that We have assigned you, jointly and severally, and every one of you, our Justices to keep our Peace, in our Colony of Western Australia, and to keep, and cause to be kept, all Ordinances and Statutes, for the good of the Peace, and for the preservation of the same, and for the quiet rule and government of our people, made in all and singular their articles in our said colony, according to the force, form, and effect, of the same, And to chastise and punish all persons that offend against the form of those Ordinances or Statutes, or any one of them in the aforesaid Colony, as it ought to be done, according to the form of those Ordinances and Statutes; And to cause to come before you, or any of you, all those who to anyone or more of our people, concerning their bodies, or the firing their houses, have used threats to find sufficient security for the peace, or their good behaviour towards us and our people; and if they shall refuse to find such security, then them in our prisons, until they shall find such security to cause to be safely kept.

We have also assigned you and every two or more of you (of whom any one of you, the aforesaid Archibald Paull Burt, George Frederick Stone, Henry Wakeford, Thomas Brown, Sir Alexander Thomas Cockburn Campbell, Samuel Waterman, Viveash, Charles Augustus John Symmonds, Lewis John Bayly, Alfred, Durlacher, George Eliot, Joseph Strelley Harris, David Smythe Murray, Thomas Hester, we will shall be one) our Justices, to inquire the truth more fully by the oath of good and lawful men of the aforesaid Colony, by whom the truth of the matter shall be better known, of all and all manner of felonies, poisonings, trespasses, forestallings, regratings, ingrossings and extortions whatsoever; And of all and singular other crimes and offences, of which the Justices of our peace may or ought lawfully to enquire, by whomsoever, and after what manner soever in the said Colony done or perpetrated, or which shall happen to be there done or attempted, and also of all those who in the aforesaid Colonies in companies against our peace, in disturbance of our people with armed force have gone or rode, or hereafter shall presume to go or ride; And also of all those who have there lain in wait, or hereafter shall presume to lie in wait to maim, or cut, or kill our people; And also of all Victuallers, and all and singular other persons, who in the abuse of weights or measures, or in selling victuals against the form of the Ordinances and Statutes, or any one of them therefore made or in force for the common benefit of the said colony, and our people thereof, have offended or attempted, or hereafter shall presume, in the said Colony to offend or attempt. And also of all Sheriffs, Constables, keepers of Gaols, and other Officers who, in the execution of their offices about the premises. or any of them, have unduly behaved themselves, or hereafter shall presume to behave themselves unduly or have been, or shall happen hereafter to be careless, remiss, or negligent, in our aforesaid Colony. And of all and singular articles and circumstances, and all other things whatsoever, that concern the premises, or any of them, by whomsoever and after what manner soever, in our aforesaid Colony done or perpetrated, or which hereafter shall there happen to be done or attempted, in what manner soever. And to inspect all Indictments whatsoever, so before you or any of you taken or to be taken, or before others, late our Justices of the Peace, in the aforesaid Colony, made or taken, and not yet determined; And to make and continue processes thereupon, against all and singular the persons so indicted, or who before you hereafter shall happen to be indicted until they can be taken, surrender themselves, or be out-lawed; And to hear and determine all and singular the felonies, poisonings, trespasses, forestallings, regratings, ingros-sings, extortions, unlawful assemblies, indictments aforesaid, and all and singular other the premises, according to the laws and Ordinances of the said Colony, as in the like case it has been accustomed or ought to be done; And the same offenders and every of them for their offences by fines, ransoms, amerciaments, forfeitures and other means, as according to the law and custom of the said Colony, or form of the Ordinances and Statutes aforesaid, it has been accustomed or ought to be done, to chastise or punish

Probibed always, that if a case of difficulty upon the determination of any of the premises before you, or any two or more of you shall happen to arise, then let judgment in nowise be given thereon before you or any two or more of you, unless in the presence of our Chief Justice of our said Colony. And therefore, we command you, and every of you, that to the keeping of the peace Ordinances and Statues, and all and singular other the premises, you diligently apply yourselves, and that at certain days and places appointed for these purposes, into the premises you make inquiries, and all and singular the premises hear and determine, and perform and fulfil them in the aforesaid form, doing therein what to Justice appertains, according to the law and custom of the said Colony; Saving to us the fines and other things to us therefrom belonging.

And we command, by the tenor of these presents, our Sheriff of Western Australia, that at certain days and places which you or any such two or more of you as is aforesaid, shall make known to him he cause to come before you or such two or more of you as aforesaid, so many and such good and lawful men of his bailiwick, by whom the truth of the matter in the premises shall be better known and inquired into.

In Culturess whereof, we have caused our trusty and well-beloved Arthur Edward Kennedy, Esquire, our Governor of our said Colony, to sign these presents, and to affix hereto the Public Seal of our said Colony, this first day of February, in the twenty-fifth year of our Reign, and in the year of our Lord, one thousand, eight hundred and sixty two.

£5000 Reward.

Colonial Secretary's Office, Perth, Western Australia, 1st February, 1862.

T is hereby notified for general information, that the Local Government of Western Australia offer as a reward for the discovery of a workable gold field within a radius of one hundred and fifty miles from the Public Offices in the City of Perth, on or before the 31st day of December 1862, the sum of £5000 0 0 upon the following conditions :—

1. That the reward be not payable until 5000 ounces of gold of standard purity at the least, and either alluvial or crushed from quartz, and obtained from such gold field be entered and cleared at the Custom House in Fremantle, and actually shipped to Great Britain, either in one entry or by several entries before the 1st day of July 1863.

2. That the Governor of the Colony for the time being in Executive Council do finally adjudicate and determine to whom alone, or if there be several claimants, to whom, and in what proportions, and under what circumstances, such reward shall be payable and paid.
