PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency John Stephen Hampton, Esquire, Governor and Commander in Chief, in and over the Territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies, and Vice Admiral of the same.

WHEREAS Her Most Gracious Majesty has been graciously pleased by Commission under the Great Seal of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, bearing date the Second Day of November, One Thousand Eight Hundred and Sixty One to constitute and appoint me John Stephen Hampton, Esquire, Her Governor and Commander in Chief in and over the Territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies. Now I the Governor and Commander in Chief aforesaid do hereby proclaim and declare that I have taken the prescribed Oaths in due form in the Executive Council of the said Territory, and that I have assumed the administration of the said Government accordingly.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency John Bruce, Esquire, a Brevet Lieutenant Colonel in Her Majesty's Army, Senior Military Officer in Command of Her Majesty's Land Forces and Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over

the Territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies and Vice Admiral of the same.

IN pursuance of the Authority in me vested by the 16th Section of an Ordinance passed in the 19th year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, No. 15, entitled "An Ordinance to consolidate and amend the Laws respecting the "licensing of Boats and Boatmen," I do hereby notify and proclaim that the under-mentioned are and shall be additional regulations to be observed for the preservation of the Government Jetty in the South Bay at Fremantle, until altered or amended as occasion may require.

1. All Coasters, Cargo Boats, or other Vessels brought alongside of the end of the Jetty in South Bay, Fremantle, for the purpose of loading or discharging cargo, with the wind at south to south west must have a warp made fast to the buoy placed to the southward, and when the wind is anything to the northward of west to the bouy placed to the north west of such jetty.

2. No person shall make fast any tackle purchase or other gear to any part of the cranes placed at the end of the South Bay jetty, Fremantle.
