INTELLIGENCE of the demise of The Prince Consort not having been received in this Colony until after the period fixed in England for the discontinuance of mourning, His Excellency the Governor directs, as a mark of respect on this melancholy occasion, that the Public Offices be closed on Tuesday next, the 18th instant. The Flag at Government House to continue hoisted half-mast high until the evening of that day, when forty two minute guns will be fired; the last gun to be fired and the flag to be dropped as the sun sets.

MR. ADAMS TO EARL RUSSELL.

"HE undersigned, &c., has the honor to inform the Right Honorable Earl Russell, &c., that the American barque "Cochituate," G. Hatbands, master, was wrecked on one of Abrolhos' Islands,

about 35 miles to the Westward of Champion Bay, Western Australia, on the morning of the 14th June last. The master and crew of the ill fated barque landed on the coast to the South of Champion Bay, and wandered about the country for the space of fourteen days, and were reduced almost to a state of starvation, when intelligence of the disaster reached head quarters, whence parties of Police were dispatched to their assistance with supplies of food and clothing. The entire party were thereby recovered and maintained at the cost of the Colony, until means were found for their shipment to the United States. Upon these facts becoming known, the Government instructed the Vice Consul of the United States at Singapore to convey their thanks to the authorities of Western Australia and to reimburse to them the expenses incurred.

The undersigned is also instructed to convey to Her Majesty's Government the thanks of the President for the timely assistance rendered by Her Majesty's Colonial Authorities on the occasion in question, and the high sense entertained by the Government of the United States of their friendly and humane conduct.
