THE following boundaries defining the
several District Residencies of Perth,
Fremantle, and the Swan are published
for general information.

PERTH RESIDENCY,

Bounded on the *West* by the Sea Coast
on the *South* by the North boundary of
North Fremantle townsite, by the southern
shore of the Swan inlet and by the river
Canning upwards to the upper boundary
of Canning location No 2; on the *East* by
the south east boundaries of said location
and of Swan location 34 known as Belmont,
then by N.E. boundary of said location 34
prolonged N.W. to the River Swan's right
bank, then by a line extending N. by W.
to east side of Lake Gnangarra, and then
by a north line; and on the *North* by a
west line to the Sea Coast through north
end of Lake Nowergup; all bearings true.

FREMANTLE RESIDENCY,

Bounded on the *West* by the Sea Coast;
on the *South* by an east line from the south
side of Mangle's Bay; and on the *East*
and *North* by Swan inlet and River Can-
ning, by the north and east boundaries of
Kelmscott townsite, and by the north
boundary of North Fremantle townsite.

SWAN RESIDENCY,

Bounded on the *West* by the Sea Coast;
on the *South* by an east line through north
end of Lake Nowergup, then by a south
line to east side of Lake Gnangarra, then
by a S. by E. line to Swan River's right
bank at the upper boundary of Peninsular
Farm, then by upper boundary of Swan
location 34 known as Belmont, then by S.
E. boundaries of said location, and of Can-
ning location No. 2, then by Canning River
upwards to a spot lying east from the bot-
tom of Mangle's Bay; on the *East* by a
northerly line from spot aforesaid, to sum-
mit of Mount Dale, thence to the half-way

House (inclusive) on the York Road from Guildford, thence to Bailip (exclusive) on Toodyay Road, and thence to head of River Moore; and on the *North* by a westerly line to the Sea: all bearings true.
