PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency John Stephen Hampton, Esquire, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies, and Vice Admiral of the same.

WHEREAS the undermentioned Ordinances were passed by His Excellency Arthur Edward Kennedy, Esquire, then Governor of the said Colony, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, in the 25th Year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, and intituled:—

No. 4. An Ordinance to repeal an Ordinance intituled "An Ordinance for licensing Hawkers and Pedlers."

No. 5. "An Ordinance for the more speedy levying of Forfeited Recognizances."

No. 6. "An Ordinance to amend an Ordinance to make compulsory the Practice of Vaccination."

Now, THEREFORE, I the said John Stephen Hampton, do hereby proclaim and make known unto all whom it may concern that Her Majesty has been graciously pleased to confirm and allow the before mentioned Ordinances.
