WELLINGTON RESIDENCY.—
Bounded on the *West* by the sea-coast;
on the *North* by an East line from the said
coast to the River Murray passing through
the summit of Mount William, then the
Murray and Williams Rivers upwards
(exclusive of the licenses and locations on
either bank of each) to Bannister townsite
on the Williams, and then an East line in-
definitely: and on the *South* by an East
line from the seacoast to Capel River
through the North end of Wonnerop Inlet,
then by said river upwards to location 171
(inclusive), then by a South-eastly line
to junction of Paddy Brook with the
River Blackwood, then by the Blackwood
upwards to its junction with Balgarrup
River, and then by an East line indefinitely.
All bearings true

SUSSEX RESIDENCY—Bounded on
the *North* by an East line from the sea coast
to Capel River through the North end of
Wonnerup Inlet, then by said river up-

wards to location 171 (exclusive), then by a South-easterly line to the junction of Padbury Brook with the River Blackwood, and then by the Blackwood upwards to its junction with Balgarrup River: on the *West* and *South* by the seacoast; and on the *East* by a South-westerly line from the mouth of Balgarrup River to Point D'Entrée steaux. IN reference to the arrival of Immigrants, shortly expected per "Mary Harrison," it is hereby notified for general information, that no person will be allowed to engage Immigrants until after they shall have been received into depôt either at Fremantle or Perth, where all applications must be made to the respective Immigration Agents, by whom every facility and information will be afforded.

No person will on any account be permitted to go on board the ship for the purpose of engaging Immigrants.

Persons residing at a distance from Fremantle and Perth, will authorise in writing agents at those places to make such arrangements as they may desire for the engagement and forwarding to them such Immigrants as they may require.

The local government will not in any way undertake the selection or transmission of Immigrants to rural districts.

The following Immigrants eligible for engagement are expected per "Mary Harrison."

About 100 single women.
30 married couples.
10 single men.
