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PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency John Stephen Hampton, Esquire, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same.

WHEREAS the undermentioned Ordinance was passed by His Excellency Arthur Edward Kennedy, Esquire, then Governor of the said Colony, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, in the 25th Year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, and intituled No. 7 "An Ordinance for the further appropriation of the Revenue for the year 1860, and for the general appropriation of the Revenue for the year 1862."

NOW THEREFORE, I, the said John Stephen Hampton, do hereby proclaim and make known unto all whom it may concern that Her Majesty has been graciously pleased to confirm and allow the before mentioned Ordinance.

THE following Regulations, to be observed at the Custom House, at Fremantle, are published for general information.

By His Excellency's command
FRED. P. BARLEE,
Colonial Secretary.

1. Hours for the transaction of Public business at the Custom House, from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m., except Saturdays, when the Office will be closed at noon.

2. Holidays in the Customs: Christmas Day, Good Friday, The Anniversary of the Foundation of the Colony, and the day appointed for the Celebration of Her Majesty's Birthday.

3. No clearances of Vessels will be granted unless all the official documents connected therewith are deposited at the Custom House before 3 o'clock and 12 on Saturdays, but nothing shall prevent the Collector of Customs granting a clearance at any time.

4. Masters of Coasters shall produce Manifests in duplicate, Cargo Book, and all other necessary papers before the hours for closing, or the clearance will not be made out until next day.

5. No Coasters will be permitted to cross the bar without first obtaining the sanction of the Collector.

6. Boats plying to and from Vessels in Port, without the Collector's license, will be dealt with as the Law directs.

7. Any Boat proceeding to Perth laden with cargo from Vessels in Port, prior to delivery of permit to the Landing Waiter, and obtaining his written permission to proceed, will be subject to loss of Collector's license.

8. Exporters are reminded that Duty Free goods shipped prior to entry render them liable to a fine of from £10 to £30, and in the event of any sandalwood being shipped prior to entry, it becomes seizable.

9. Agents are cautioned to give notice to Collector upon arrival of a Vessel having Gunpowder on board, who will grant a special surffiance for it to be landed under 14 Vict., No. 9.

10. Parties unaccustomed to enter and clear goods at the Custom House are advised to employ an Agent, as the practice of writing entries and receiving instructions from the Clerks at the Counter is disallowed; proper forms will be supplied upon application. Merchants and others are requested to fill up their entries as far as possible prior to passing at the Custom House.

12. Proprietors may have Spirits re-gauged and other Goods re-weighed, on written application to Collector, without charge.

13. Special charges, according to service performed, at option of Collector.

15. The Government will not hold themselves responsible for leakage or waste by natural causes. Every care and precaution to prevent the same while goods are lodged in the Queen's Warehouses will be taken.

16. Proprietors may transfer to any other person whole packages of goods of any kind, standing in their names in the books of the Customs, by addressing a written request to the Collector; but no transfer for the future will be noticed unless the package or packages are properly described by mark, number, and importing ship, which coincide with the registered entries in the Warehouse. Transfers should be presented at the Custom House as soon as possible by parties receiving the same.

17. The Government will not be answerable for any charge for freight upon goods from importing ship to shore, but if goods are entered for Bond by the Agent of any vessel to facilitate her discharge, they will be detained until such charges are satisfied.

18. The Government will not hold themselves responsible for any complaints made of bonded goods after removal from the Bonded Stores. While in Store and on removal every facility will be afforded to owners of bonded goods to examine and verify the contents of casks and packages.

Roads on the Greenough Flats.

IT is hereby notified for general information, that the two roads hereunder described, passing over and near to the Upper Greenough Flats, are declared to be public lines of communication, pursuant to existing Ordinances.

1. Greenough Road, one chain wide, extending about West from Tillage lease 2133 to the East corner of Tillage lease 1329, situate 40 chains South-east from East corner of Victoria location 338, then South-west 50 chains to Gregory Road.

2. Part of Road from Irwin River to Champion Bay, one chain wide, extending North-west about 450 chains to a spot about 13 chains North-east from a sharp bend in the River Greenough, and then about 140 chains North-east three quarters of a point North to South end of Arthur Road, and finally North-west nearly 400 chains along Arthur Road, to its junction with Bootenal Road;—all bearings true.
