Roads on the Greenough Flats.

T is hereby notified for general information, that the two roads hereunder described, passing over and near to the Upper Greenough Flats, are declared to be public lines of communication, pursuant to xeisting Ordinances.

- Greenough Road, one chain wide, extending about West from Tillage lease 2133 to the East corner of Tillage lease 1329, situate 40 chains South-east from East corner of Victoria location 338, then South-west 50 chains to Gregory Road.
- 2. Part of Road from Irwin River to Champion Bay, one chain wide, extending North-west about 450 chains to a spot about 13 chains North-east from a sharp bend in the River Greenough, and then about 140 chains North-east three quarters of a point North to South end of Arthur Road, and finally North-west nearly 400 chains along Arthur Road, to its junction with Bootenal Road;—all bearings true.
