*By His Excellency John Stephen Hampton Esquire, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same.*

**W**HEREAS the undermentioned Ordinance was passed by His Excellency Arthur Edward Kennedy Esquire, then Governor of the said Colony, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, in the 25th year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, and intituled:—

No. 12. “An Ordinance to amend the Customs Ordinance of 1860.”

NOW THEREFORE I, the said John Stephen Hampton, do hereby proclaim and make known unto all whom it may concern that Her Majesty has been graciously pleased to confirm and allow the beforementioned Ordinance.
