Road between Bunbury and the River Blackwood.

IT is hereby notified for general information, that it is the intention of the Government as soon as means may be available for the purpose, to survey, lay out and declare a public road, one chain wide, between Bunbury Townsite and the bridge over the River Blackwood at Blechynden's Station Geegelup.

From Bunbury to the Preston River Bridge between Wellington location 30 and 39, the road will pass as described in a Gazette Notice dated 11th May, 1860.

From said Bridge the Road will ascend the Preston River along its left bank, passing through or near the several locations on that bank, to the bridge over Minninup Brook, a tributary to said bank in Pastoral lease 762: thence it will take a nearly straight south south-east direction for 6 miles to Corderup Hill, and 6 miles further to Mulalyup Brook, passing on east side of Kerap Swamp: Crossing to left bank of Brook aforesaid, the road will proceed 3 miles southeasterly to and through Nelson locations 38 and 9, and will cross the bridge over Padbury Brook between those locations; thence it will take a general south east direction about 14½ miles to a spot a quarter of a mile within the south-east corner of Pastoral lease 878, leaving

Mr. E. G. Hester's station at Martinup about a mile to the south-west; it will then take a south course for a mile to the bridge over the Blackwood River at Geegelup, passing through Blechynden's location 12 on that rivers' right bank.

The above road will pass as much as possible over the track now in use, as amended by Mr. R. Austin in December, 1859, and full particulars of it will be published in a future notice, after the road shall have been more fully surveyed and laid out. The public are in the mean time cautioned against fencing across or otherwise obstructing the road in use.
