## NORTH EAST COAST.

The bearings are Magnetic. Variation, 5½° East in 1862.

TNFORMATION has been received from the Colonial Government of Victoria, Australia. dated 23rd May 1862. that Commander Norman, of H.M. Colonial Steam Sloop Victoria, on his passage through the Inner route of Torres Strait, discovered a dangerous rock about 8 miles northward of Cape Sidmouth; also that he has verified the existence of Chilcott rocks which have hitherto been considered doubtful.\*

The Norman rock is about 30 yards broad, of coral formation, and has only 2 feet on it at low water. It lies about one-third of a mile off the west side of No. VIII. Island, in a position which passing vessels might choose for anchorage with easterly winds.

The Chilcott rocks, lying off the eastern

The Chilcott rocks, lying off the eastern side of the same island, near the fair-way of the Inner route, were found at low water, the southern one in the position

marked in the Admiralty chart, and the northern one bearing North from it, it is stated at 150 yards apart (Lieut. Woods' plan which accompanied Commander Norman's report places them one-third of a mile apart); they are both flat topped, about 20 to 25 yards in extent, steep-to all round, with 7 fathoms water between them; a small lump of coral was dry  $1\frac{1}{2}$  feet on the southern rock. The safest course to avoid them is to borrow to the eastward towards the Barrier reefs rather than towards No. VIII. island, until well north or south of the island.
