WHEREAS the undermentioned Ordinance was passed by His Excellency John Stephen Hampton, Esquire, Governor of the said Colony, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, in the 25th year of the Reign of her Majesty Queen Victoria and intituled—

No. 18. “An Ordinance to amend the “Jury Ordinance, 1858.”

Now therefore I, the said John Stephen Hampton do hereby proclaim and make known unto all whom it may concern that Her Majesty has been graciously pleased to confirm and allow the before mentioned Ordinance.

COMMONAGE ON TOWNSITES.

IT is hereby notified for general information that, until further Notice, all resident proprietors of purchased lots of land within the limits of any Townsite of the Colony not having a duly constituted Town Trust, will be allowed free pasturage for horses and cattle on the unappropriated portions of any such Townsite, in relative proportion to the number of lots each such proprietor, or his tenant, may be occupying therein.

Any other person found depasturing live stock of any description on any such Townsite, will be deemed a trespasser on Crown Lands, and will be dealt with accordingly.

Persons found depasturing live stock of any kind without a license, on any Townsite not laid out in lots for sale, will also be considered trespassers, and will be dealt with in like manner.

By a notice in the Government Gazette dated 25th August, 1857, all persons other than *bona fide* travellers, are

prohibited grazing stock on any of the Public Reserves along the various lines of road.
