All non-resident proprietors or lessees of land within the limits herein specified who may run stock thereon, will be deemed trespassers; as also any person whatever depasturing sheep or horses on the commonage

The whole will be open, as heretofore, for purchase or tillage lease, but not for exclusive pastoral license.
