By His Excellency John Stephen Hampton, Esquire, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Western Australia and its Dependencies and Vice-Admiral of the same.

HEREAS by the First Section of an Ordinance passed in the 14th year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, No. 14, and intituled "An Ordinance for licensing Carts and Carriers," power is given to the Governor of the said Colony to extend the provisions of such Ordinance to such other towns as he may deem expedient.

Now therefore I, John Stephen Hampton, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the said Colony, do hereby notify and proclaim that I have extended the provisions of the said Ordinance to the town of Guildford.
