PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency John Stephen Hampton, Esquire, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Territory of Western Aus-tralia and its Dependencies and Vice-Admiral of the same.

THEREAS by the 75th Section of an Ordinance passed in the 25th year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, and intituled "No. 15, An Ordi-"nance to consolidate and amend the "Laws relating to the Police in Western "Australia, and for removing and prevent-"ing nuisances and obstructions therein," power is given to the Governor of the said Colony to extend the provisions of Clause 38 of the said Ordinance to such other towns as he may deem expedient :

Now therefore I, John Stephen Hampton, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the said Colony, do hereby notify and proclaim that I have extended the provisions of the said Clause to the town of Bunbury.

III Excellency the Governor has been pleased to direct that from and after this date the names and trades of all Probation Prisoners will be published in the Government Gazette as they become eligible for discharge upon Ticket-of-Leave, and no Probation Prisoner will in future be released on Ticket-of-Leave until he is either hired into private service, or can shew satisfactorily that he has the means of earning his own livelihood.

The gratuity of all such Prisoners will cease from the] dates on which they are respectively gazetted as eligible for Ticket-of-Leave.

So long as the Prisoners are maintained by the Government they will be employed on the Public Works, and will be allowed tobacco under Issue in kind No. 237.
