- An Ordinance for the Regulation of Benefit Building Societies.
- An Ordinance to compel River Steam Vessels to carry a boat.
- An Ordinance to amend the Colonial Passengers Ordinance 1861.
- An Ordinance for preventing Frauds upon Creditors, by secret Bills of sale of personal chattels.
- An Ordinance for vesting all Estates and Property occupied by or for the Naval Service of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland in the Lord High Admiral, or the Commissioners for executing the office of Lord High Admiral of the said United Kingdom, for the time being.
- An Ordinance to confirm the Expenditure for the services of the year 1862 beyond the grant for that year.
- An Ordinance for vesting certain lands in the City of Perth, in Her Majesty.
- An Ordinance to facilitate the sale of Colonial Wine.
- An Ordinance to appropriate and apply the sum of seventy thousand one hundred and forty pounds, out of the general revenue of the Colony for the service of the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty four.
- An Ordinance to encourage the cultivation of the Vine, by permitting Distillation of the produce thereof, under certain restrictions.
- An Ordinance to extend the Jurisdiction of the Police and Resident Magistrates.
- An Ordinance to regulate the Pensioners Benevolent Society.

IT is hereby notified for the information of the Public that on and after the 1st of September next, Post Office Savings Banks will be opened at the undermentioned Post Offices:—

Perth
Fremantle
Guildford
York
Newcastle
Bunbury
Vasse
Albany
Champion Bay
Pinjarrah

These Banks will be open for the receipt and repayment of deposits on every working day from nine in the morning till four in the evening.

In these Banks deposits may be made to the amount of one shilling or any number of shillings, or of Pounds and shillings, provided the deposits do not amount to more than £30 in any one year.

When the first deposit is made the Depositor will receive a numbered Book in which his name, address and occupation and the date and amount of his deposit will be entered.

On the day on which the deposit is made the Postmaster must report to the Post Master General that he has received the money from the Depositor and in two or three days afterwards he will receive a printed letter from the General Post Office to inform him that his deposit has been duly reported;—If the depositor do not receive such a letter within ten days from the day on which he made his deposit, he must write to the Post Master General for it.

Any Depositor wishing to withdraw money which he has deposited, can apply to the nearest Post Office Savings Bank for a printed form of application.—He must fill up the form in the manner pointed out in the printed Regulations, and send the application to the General Post Office, Perth.—By the return Mail he will receive a Warrant from Perth which will enable him to receive his money at the Post Office named by him.

While the money of any Depositor lies in the Post Office Savings Bank, he will be allowed interest on it at the rate of Three Pounds Fifteen Shillings per annum for every Hundred Pounds, that is, he will receive nine pence a year or three farthings a month for every complete Pound which he may deposit.

Parents may deposit for their children and women whether married or single may deposit on their own account.

Depositors will not have to pay the postage of any letters which they may write to or receive from the General Post Office with respect to their deposits.

The Post Masters are forbidden to disclose the names of Depositors or the amounts they may deposit, to any one but the Post Master General or to any other officer duly authorised by the Government.

ROAD BETWEEN FREMANTLE AND PINJARRAH.

Colonial Secretary's Office,
Perth, 1st July, 1863.

IT is hereby notified for general information, that it is the intention of the Government to survey and lay out, as soon as convenient, a line of road between Fremantle and Pinjarrah, via Stake Hill, and the Serpentine and Dandalup bridges, with a view to the same being cleared and opened for use as a public line of communication pursuant to the provisions of existing Ordinances.

The road will be one chain wide, commencing at south end of South Terrace, Fremantle, and extending southerly, as already surveyed and laid out, to location 101, where it joins another surveyed branch extending southerly from Fremantle through locations 7, 33, 128, 113, 126, 87, 101, 85 and 102. From south boundary of 102 the road will take a southerly direction through locations 13 and 14 near Brown Hill, then pass southerly outside the east boundary of location 129, and outside the west boundaries of locations 125 and 121, to the N.W. corners of 130, 72 and 92,—thence entering Cockburn Sound location 16, and passing in a southerly direction through it by the Lakes Cooloongup and Walyungup, and by Stake

Hill. Continuing in a southerly direction, the road will cross the bridge over the Serpentine, and 8 miles further S.E., by S. will cross that over the Dandalup, whence in $2\frac{3}{4}$ miles further south it will reach the bridge over the Murray a Pinjarrah.

The above road will pass as near as may be found convenient along the tracks at present in use; and parties are warned against fencing across or otherwise obstructing those tracks, until the permanent lines may be finally laid out and declared

Road between Pinjarrah and Bunbury, via Waterloo.

IT is hereby notified for general information, that it is the intention of the Government to survey and lay out, as soon as convenient, a line of road between Pinjarrah and Bunbury, via Waterloo, with a view to the same being cleared and opened for use as a public line of communication, pursuant to the provisions of existing Ordinances.

The road will be one chain wide, commencing at west end of the Murray bridge at Pinjarrah, and will ascend the left bank of the Murray for about 12 miles through locations 3, 7, 8 and 9, diverging then in a south-easterly direction for 6 miles to location 26. Passing southerly through locations 26 and 10, it will extend south-south-westerly for 7 miles to location 29 on Cockernup Brook, then through or near to that location, and $5\frac{1}{2}$ miles further in the same average direction to a bridge over the Harvey River about $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles within the east boundary of Wellington location 50 A. Thence it will take a south-westerly direction about 130 chains to a bridge at Wokolup on the Wellesley, and will continue a mile further to the north end of Ommanney Road in Wellington location 1. Passing $9\frac{3}{4}$ miles in a S by $W\frac{1}{4}$ W direction along Ommanney Road, it will then diverge a quarter of a mile in a southerly direction to a bridge over the Brunswick 120 yards east of that road, and thence take a south-westerly direction for $4\frac{1}{2}$ miles to a part of Waterloo Townsite a little within its N E corner. Descending the Collie about 2 miles from that spot in a westerly direction, nearly parallel to its course, and through Waterloo Townsite and locations 4 and 2, the road will cross that river at a bridge a little within the west boundary of the Townsite; it will then extend 4 miles west-south-westerly through locations 49, 19, 6 and 26, to the declared road near Vittoria Bay in Leschenault Inlet, following that declared line one mile south-westerly to the bridge over the Preston River, and terminating at the Townsite of Bunbury, $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles further westward.

The above road will pass as near as may be found convenient along the tracks at present in use; and parties are warned

against fencing across or otherwise obstructing those tracks until the permanent lines may be finally laid out and declared.
