Sir,

I have the honor to inform you that I duly communicated to the Lord Mayor Copies of your Despatch marked separate of the 24th of March and 21st of May enclosing respectively Commissariat Receipts for the sum of £410 and £152 16 11 being the amounts which had been raised in the Colony through the instrumentality of Colonel Bruce in Aid of the Lancashire Relief Fund.

The Lords Commissioners of the Treasury to whom the Commissariat Receipts were transmitted have informed me that directions have been given for paying to the order of the Lord Mayor the amounts which have been so liberally contributed by the Inhabitants of Western Australia.

With reference to my letter of the 18th June, I have now much pleasure in acknowledging the receipt, through H. M. Paymaster General, of a further sum of £152 16 11 which was subscribed in Western Australia in aid of the above Fund. I am desired by the Mansion House Committee to inform your Excellency of the gratification they experienced on receiving this further testimony of the sympathy of the Inhabitants of Western Australia for their distressed fellow subjects in the Cotton districts of England, and I am further directed to convey their sincere thanks to your Excellency and Lieut Colonel Bruce for the kind manner in which you have interested yourselves in the receipt and transmission of subscriptions to this Country.

IS Excellency the Governor has been pleased to appoint Mr. John E. Stirling to be Assistant Registrar for the Victoria District.

"Tenders for the conveyance of Albany Mail," will be received at this office up to noon, on Monday, the 16th of November next, for the conveyance of Colonial and Foreign Mails between Perth and Albany for one year, or three years, commencing on the 1st of January, 1864

Tenders to embrace the following points:

- For conveyance of a monthly mail from Perth to Albany, and vice versa, at per month.
- 2. For conveyance of Express mails from Albany to Perth, at any time during the month, (on being called upon to do so by the Postmaster, Albany,) at per trip,

and.

3. For conveyance of a bi-monthly mail from Perth to Albany, and vice versá, at per month.

It is not intended to adopt the service named in No. 3 paragraph, unless bimonthly steam communication between England and the Australian Colonies is established, but in such event, the accepted tender for a bi-monthly mail would then be put into operation.

The contractor to convey the mails at such dates in each month as may be fixed by the Postmaster General.

Parties tendering to state the time in which they will undertake to convey the mails between Perth and Albany, and vice versá.

The tender stipulating to convey the mails in the shortest time between the two places will have the preference.

In case the contractor should fail to deliver the mails at either Perth or Albany, within his contract time, in consequence of the overlading of the Mail cart, with passengers or luggage, &c, he will be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20, exclusive of any sum recoverable by his bond.

In the event of the Mail Packets discontinuing to touch at King George's Sound during the period of the contract, the unexpired portion of it to be cancelled.

The arrival and departure of the mail will be subject to instructions from the Postmaster General, and liable to alterations at any time during the contract.

Two approved sureties will be required to join the contractor in a guarantee for the due fulfilment of the duties contracted to be performed.

No payment will be made on account of the contract, until the bond shall have been signed by the contractor and his sureties, and any breach of contract in the wilful or negligent departure or delivery of the mail at the appointed days and hour will subject the contractor to the loss of a proportionate part of his monthly pay, or the cancellation of his contract.

The contractor is to convey and deliver all mails which may be entrusted to him under the authority of the Postmaster General, or the Postmaster at Albany, and to provide secure, and watertight lockers for the mails, and covering for the same. He will moreover be bound not to himself convey, or permit his servant to convey any letter or packet to the prejudice of the Post Office Revenue under a penalty of £3 for each offence, which penalty will be reducted from his monthly pay.

The persons employed by the contractor to convey the mail are to be subject to the approval of the Postmaster General, both as to age and character.

Further particulars may be obtained on reference to the Postmaster General at whose office forms of Tender may be had, as well as from the Resident Magistrates.
