WARRANT.

By His Excellency John Stephen Hampton Esquire, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies.

ALL to whom these presents shall

come Greeting:-

Withereas by the Customs Ordinance One Thousand Eight Hundred and Sixty it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor with the advice of the Executive Council by his Warrant from time to time to appoint the Ports in the said Colony which shall be Warehousing Ports for the purposes of that Ordinance and also what sorts of Goods in addition to Wines, Spirits, and Tobacco may and may only be Warehoused and kept and secured without payment of any duty on the first entry thereof:— NOW KNOW YE that by virtue and in exercise of the authority aforesaid I the said Governor with the advice of the Executive Council DO HEREBY appoint the Port of GERALDTON in the said Colony to be a Warehousing Port for all the purposes of the said Ordinance AND I hereby also with the advice aforesaid appoint and declare that all sorts of Goods in addition to Wines, Spirits, and Tobacco may be warehoused and kept and secured without payment of any duty upon the first entry thereof at Geraldton aforesaid.

Notice to Owners of Boats, and Boatmen.

Court House, Fremantle, 1st December, 1863.

HE Board appointed by His Excellency the Governor, for the purpose of Licensing Boats, and Boatmen, for the year 1864, will assemble at the Court House, Fremantle, on Thursday, the 31st of December inst., at 11 o'clock in the forenoon; also on Thursday, the 15th of January, 1864, at the same hour.

Owners of Boats and Flats in Peath, and Fremantle, will have their Boats ready for inspection at the North or South Jetties, betwixt the hours of ten and twelve on the respective Licensing days.

Names and numbers to be painted upon Boats, before submitted to the inspection of the Board.

Boatmen applying for Licenses under the Act, will come prepared with such certificates of character and competency as they may be able to obtain.

All parties found working Boats without a License after the above mentioned Licensing days, will be fined according to Act of Council.

Cart Licenses will also be granted on the same days.
