Road between Fremantle and Preston Point, &c.

IT is hereby notified for general information, that it is the intention of the Government to lay out and open public roads between Fremantle and Preston Point, and thence towards the lower Canning bridge, with a view to the same being declared public lines of communication in terms of existing Ordinances.
