PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency John Stephen Hampton, Esquire, Governor and Commander-in-Chief, in and over the Territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same.

N pursuance of the authority in me vested by the 16th Section of an Ordinance, passed in the 19th year of the Reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, No. 15, intituled "an Ordinance to consolidate and amend the Laws respecting "the Licensing of Boats and Boatmen," I do hereby notify and proclaim that the Regulations hereunto annexed are and shall be the Regulations observed for the preservation of the South Jetty, at Fremantle Ferry, until altered or amended as occasion may require.

Given under my hand and the Public Seal of the Colony at Perth, this 16th day of January, 1864.

GOD SAVE THE QUEEN!

Regulations to be observed by Boats, Flats and Boatmen to and from the South Jetty, at Fremantle Ferry.

1.—The Jetty is in charge of the Clerk of Works, of the Convict Department.

The Warder in charge of Works to to be considered as the party in charge (on the spot) for the time being.

2.—No Boat or Flat to be made fast to any Pile, Scaffold, Pole, or staging of any description, nor to the protecting stone wall of the wharf, but to the Piles put down on the wharf for that purpose.

3.—No Boat or Flat shall be allowed to remain alongside the Jetty, except for the purpose of loading or unloading, nor for any longer period than shall be reasonably required for such purpose.

4.—All goods or materials to be entirely removed from the landing place within twenty-four hours after being landed.

5.—No Boat or Flat to be made fast to that portion of the Jetty to which the Ferry Flat plies, nor goods of any description to be landed or left in the approach to the Ferry, or in any way to impede the traffic for Horses, Carriages, or Passengers.

6.—The Warder in charge will point out from time to time during the progress of the works, where goods may be landed, and no goods are to be landed contrary to his direction.

Road between Fremantle and Preston Point, &c.

Colonial Secretary's Office, Perth, 8th January, 1864.

T is hereby notified for general information, that it is the intention of the Government to lay out and open public roads between Fremantle and Preston Point, and thence towards the lower Canning bridge, with a view to the same being declared public lines of communication in terms of existing Ordinances.

1st.—A road one chain wide, extending East about $4\frac{1}{4}$ chains from S.E. corner of location 63, near Cantonment Hill, and along the North boundary of location 71, then Northerly to S.E. corner of location 65, and North to N.E. corner of that location, then to a spot about 6 chains East from N.W. corner of location 218, thence to N.W. corner of location N, and to the old ferry jetty at Preston Point.

2nd.—A road 75 links wide, extending East from road aforesaid, along the South boundary of location N, and to West boundary of location M, thence S.E. to N.E corner of location 172, thence East, along the South side of said location, and to the East boundary of location 70, and thence about E.S.E. to the present road from location 63 aforesaid, towards the lower Canning bridge. All bearings being true.
