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PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency John Stephen Hampton, Esquire, Governor and Commander-in-Chief, in and over the Territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same.

TO PURSUANCE of the authority in me vested by the 16th Section of An Ordinance passed in the 19th year of the Reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria No. 15, intituled "An Ordinance to consolidate and amend the Laws respecting the licensing of Boats and Boatmen." ** To hereby notify and proclaim that the Regulations hereunto annexed are and shall be the Regulations to be observed for the preservation of the Jetty at Albany until altered or amended as occasion may require.

REGULATIONS for the MANAGEMENT of the JETTY at ALBANY.

 No vessel or boat shall be fastened to any part of the Public Jetty at Albanv except to such ring-bolts, or fastenings as are provided for the purpose, and no vessel or boat shall lie alongside of such Jetty unless so fastened, and while loading or unloading. All Cargo Boats. Vessels, or Flats, so fastened, shall also be anchored in such a manner as to relieve the Jetty as much as possible from the weight of such craft

 No vessel or boat shall be so fastened except for the purpose of loading or unloading, or for any longer period than shall be reasonably required for such purpose.

 No Stone, Bricks, Clay, Sand, Lime, Firewood. Timber, Trypots, Cannon, or Ships' Anchors to be loaded or unloaded on the Jetty.

 Passenger Boats only shall be allowed alongside the steps of such Jetty, and for no longer period than may be necessary to embark or disembark passengers and their personal luggage.

 All goods to be removed from the Jetty within 24 hours after being landed.

6. No Gunpowder to be left on the Jetty without a keeper, nor without being well covered with a Tarpaulin.

7. No goods shall be landed on the Jetty on Sundays except in cases of extreme emergency, the permission of a Magistrate being first obtained.

8. No substance of ary kind whatsoever shall be thrown into the water from the Jetty or boats lying alongside of it.

9. No fire shall be made near the Jetty.

 No goods of any kind shall be handed over the rails of the Jetty.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency John Stephen Hampton. Esquire, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same.

HEREAS it is enacted by the second section of the "Small Debts Ordinance, 1863," that it shall be

lawful for the Governor from time to time and at any time by Proclamation published in the Western Australian Government Gazette to constitute Local Courts for the recovery of Small Debts and Demands to be holden at such times and places and within such Districts throughout the said Colony as may be most fit and convenient, and as may be specified in such Proclamations, and likewise by Proclamation to alter the time, or place, or manner of holding any such Courts. And that it has been deemed expedient to alter as hereinafter specified the times for holding Local Courts in Perth, Fremantle, Guildford, York, and Busselton.

Now therefore I the said Governor in exercise of such power do hereby notify and Proclaim that from and after the second Wednesday in the ensuing month of March, the Local Court in the District of Perth shall be holden at the Police Court in the City of Perth on the last Saturday in each Month. The Local Court in the District of Fremantle shall be holden at the Police Court in the Town of Fremantle on the last Monday in each Month. The Local Court in the District of the Swan shall be holden at the Police Court in the Town of Guildford on the last Friday in each Month, and the Local Courts in the Districts of York and Vasse respectively shall be holden at the Police Courts in the Towns of York and Busselton respectively on the second Thursday in each Month.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency John Stephen Hampton, Esquire, Governor and Commander-in-Chief, in and over the Territory of Western Australia and its Dependencies. and Vice-Admiral of the same.

HEREAS by certain Land Regulations proclaimed on the twentyeighth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and sixty, it is declared among other things that nothing in such Regulations, or in any Pastoral Lease granted thereunder should prevent the Governor from excepting from Sale, and either reserving to Her Majesty, her heirs, and successors, or disposing of in such other manner as for the public interests should seem best, such lands as might be required for facilitating the improvement and settlement of the said Colony. And whereas a Pastoral Lease No. 68, hath been granted by Her said Majesty to one William Burges, of certain lands therein described. And whereas the Public interests require that an additional Town should be established in the District of Victoria, and that the land hereinafter particularly described, being comprised within such Pastoral Lease No. 68, should be appropriated for that purpose accordingly. Now therefore If the said Governor, by virtue and in exercise of the authority in me vested, do hereby resume and reserve absolutely, and do notify and proclaim that I have resumed and reserved absolutely unto Her Most Gracious Queen Victoria, her heirs, and successors, as and for a town, all that piece or parcel of land situate in the Victoria District of the said Colony, containing five hundred acres, more or less, and forming portion of pastoral lease No. 68, now in the tenure and occupation of William Burges, Esquire, which said piece or parcel of land is known in the Survey Office of the said Colony as follows. Bounded on the North by an East line of sixty chains from the North East corner of Victoria Location 183, on the East by a South line of about eighty seven chains, on the South by a West line of about twelve chains, then by Victoria location 315 extending ten chains North, twenty-five chains West, and ten chains South, and by a West line of about thirty seven chains from the North East corner of location 141 to location 325. On the West by the East boundaries of location 325 and 324 extending about fifty one and a half chains North to the North East corner of location 324 aforesaid, and then by location 183 aforesaid extending fourteen chains East and thirty-five chains seventyone links North, and bounded on the inner part by location 207 of fifty acres extending thirty-three chains, thirty-three links East, and fifteen chains South from the North East corner of location 183 afore. said, and by location 198 of ten acres extending ten chains East and West, and ten chains North and South. All bearings being true and a squared post being placed at each intersection of boundaries.

And I further proclaim that the said Town has been named by me "Northampton."
