THE following Report on the state of the Perth Causeway Bridge, is published for general information, and His Excellency the Governor has been pleased to direct that the several suggestions made therein, be adopted.

*Perth, 30th May, 1864.*

SIR,—

In compliance with your directions, we proceeded on Saturday, the 28th instant, and inspected the work done for strengthening and securing the Perth Causeway Bridge, and report for the information of His Excellency the Governor that we are of opinion that the portions which have been repaired are now secure, and the Bridge otherwise fit for opening up again for general traffic.

We would recommend that no weights exceeding two (2) Tons on a four-wheel carriage, or one and a half (1½) Ton on a two-wheel cart or dray be taken over.

Mr. Trigg who superintended the erection, has stated that the Bridge when first erected (24 years since) was built only for light weights, such as were usually drawn over our heavy roads of sand with a two (2) horse team, the funds of the Colony being then so low as not to admit the carrying out a more substantial work. We are of opinion (from information) that the present failure of the Bridge has been caused in a great measure by a number of cattle having been driven over in a body.

We therefore submit that in future not more than six (6) head of fat cattle be allowed to be driven over at one time.

We would further suggest that the boatmen, when passing, should be cautioned against making fast any ropes, &c., to the braces, as in many instances they have been torn away, and much damage otherwise done by forcing high loaded boats under, especially when the waters are high.
