PENDING the completion of a New Bridge, the following Regulations are to be observed at the Perth Causeway Bridge, and the Warder in charge of the Works has been directed to see that they are carried out:—

No four-wheeled conveyance is to convey a weight across the Bridge exceeding two tons.

No two-wheeled conveyance to convey a weight across the Bridge exceeding one and a half tons.

Not more than six head of cattle are to cross over at one time.

Boatmen are prohibited from making fast to the Braces of the Bridge.

Assistance will be afforded on application to the Warder, in loading and unloading heavily-laden teams.

NOTICE TO MARINERS.

HIS Excellency the Governor directs the publication of the following extract from the Log Book of the "Beaver", reporting the discovery of a Reef 52 miles

in a W. by S. direction from Rottneest, in lat. 32. 6. S. long. 114. 37. E.

EXTRACT.

"At 4. 30. a.m. June 3rd the sea began to roll suddenly breaking all round the Vessel, suspecting shoal-water wore ship to the W. S. W. at 5 a.m. and stood on that course till 7. 30 a. m. then wore to the Eastward, when in about the same position as at 4 30. noticed the sea breaking heavily on the Starboard Bow in a South-East direction, shortly after this a heavy breaking sea struck the Vessel nearly turning her stern round; between 8 and 9 o'clock before the sea struck the Vessel, sounded in 31 fathom: at 10 a.m. immediately on the sea striking her, the lead was hove from forward but would not take the slack line from the head the lead certainly grounded in from 7. to 10. fathoms, the lead and line being well to windward, immediately wore ship to the W.S W. and found the sea in its natural state in less than a $\frac{1}{4}$ of a mile; on handing in the lead and line found the lead quite bright it evidently having grounded."
