CAPE ST. BLAIZE LIGHT, MOSSEL BAY.

A Lighthouse has been erected on *Cape St. Blaize, Mossel Bay*,—a Light from which will be exhibited on and after the 15th March, 1864.

Latitude of Light, 34° 11' 10" S.
Longitude, 22° 9' 31" E.
High-water at full and change, 3h. 30m.
Rise and fall, 6 to 7 feet.
Variation of the Compass, 29° 50'.
Bearings magnetic, distances nautical miles.

The *Lighthouse* is a square Tower standing on the Bluff of Cape St. Blaize, at an elevation of 240 feet above the Sea. It exhibits a *Red Fixed Light*, of the third order, Dioptric, and is visible between the bearings of N. N. W. round by the East,

South and West to S. 80° E. from a ship at the distance of 10 to 12 miles in clear weather.
