WHEREAS the undermentioned Ordinance was passed by me the said Governor with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council of the said Colony, in the 27th year of the Reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, and intitled:—
No. 18.—An Ordinance to regulate the Pensioners Benevolent Society.

Now therefore, I, the said Governor do hereby proclaim and make known to all to whom it may concern that Her Majesty has been graciously pleased to confirm and allow the same.

NORTHAMPTON TOWNSITE OPENED.

IT is hereby notified for general information that the notice under the above heading, and dated the 28th July 1864, is cancelled; and that the following notice is substituted in lieu thereof:—

One hundred and ninety six (196) Town lots of land, averaging one acre each, on the new Townsite of Northampton, situate between the Gwalla and Wanerenooka mines, have recently been laid out for sale and that the same will be open to general application for purchase by Public Auction on and after the first day of September next, at the upset price of (£5) Five pounds per lot.
